# **Subject: Adoption of Resolution Authorizing Issuance of Hospital Revenue Bonds**

Nancy Lear, Bone Counsel with Gillmore and Bell, Wendy Noren, Boone County Clerk, and Kay Murray, Boone County Treasurer, were present on behalf of this item.

Nancy Lear stated this is refunding all three outstanding bond issues, Series 1992, Series 1993, and Series 2000C of the County all of which were issued for Boone County Hospital. The gross savings will be \$2.4 million and the net savings will be \$1,329,000.

Ms. Lean noted this resolution authorizes the indenture of trust with United Missouri Bank as the trustee and sets forth all terms of the bonds, authorizes tax complaint agreement that states everything will be done to keep the bonds tax exempt, authorizes the continuance and disclosure agreement which is required by the SEC, and an escrow agreement to escrow funds until the redemption date of the outstanding bonds, which will be for the Series 2000C bond January 15, 2003 and the other tow issues February 1, 2003.

Commissioner Stamper moved to adopt the resolution authorizing the issuance of Hospital Revenue Bonds (Boone Hospital Center) Series 2002, of Boone County, Missouri; and authorizing and approving certain documents and actions in connection therewith.

Commissioner Elkin seconded the motion.

Commissioner Stamper stated this includes an excerpt of minutes of the meeting with a record of those who were present and absent and a voting record, resolution authorizing the Issuance of Hospital Refunding Bonds Series 2002, of Boone County, Missouri; and authorizing and approving certain documents and actions in connection therewith and the recitals have been included.

There was no further discussion and no public comment.

# Subject: Central Missouri Counties Human Development Corporation – First Reading of Section 8 HUD Fiscal Year 2004 Budget

Barbara Johnson, CMCHDC Accountant, and Anita Sanderson were present on behalf of this item.

Barbara Johnson stated she is presenting four items as a first reading. The first item is the budget for the Section 8 Voucher program for the surrounding counties. There are 401 vouchers for Fiscal Year 2004. The second item is a requisition for payment which authorizes HUD to disburse the funds each month for this budget. The other items are standard forms that are required to be entered along with the budget; HUD-50071 Certification for Contracts, Grants, Loans and Cooperative Agreements and the Standard Form SF-LLL the Disclosure of Lobbying.

Commissioner Stamper stated CMCHDC will periodically bring forward document for signature.

Mrs. Johnson stated the fiscal year begins for this budget on April 1, 2003. Periodically they will bring forward budget revision documents to be signed and a closing statement is brought forward once a year for signature, which is in May.

There was no further discussion on this item.

Commissioner Stamper stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

### **Subject: Public Works**

David Nichols, Design and Construction Manager, was present on behalf of these items.

### A. Heritage Foundation Report

David Nichols stated this is for a required governmental payment to the Missouri Conservation Heritage Foundation for the Georgetown Drainage Project. This is part of the process to receive a permit from the Army Corps of Engineers also a review of the waterways affected and receiving a Department of Natural Resources water quality certification. This payment is in the amount of \$9,262.00 to be used as the discretion of the Department of Natural Resources anywhere in Missouri.

The department decided to make the payment to the trust rather than finding a buffer zone that the department could set aside, maintain, and do planning with a guarantee over five years because finding the dedication of a buffer zone within that watershed would be a long term issue.

Commissioner Elkin stated he requested Mr. Nichols to research this and find a way to keep this payment local. Mr. Nichols informed Commissioner Elkin that the paper would be involved in keeping the money would not be cost effective.

Mr. Nichols noted the options are limited for finding a buffer zone.

There was no further discussion on this item.

# **B.** First Reading for Approval of Variance Request from the Road and Bridge Advisory Committee

Mr. Nichols stated the Road and Bridge Advisory Committee approved the variance request by Mr. Bill Regan to allow the southern driveway of the property to be installed 120 feet from another drive, rather than the 150' required by Boone County Specifications.

He noted the proximity of the driveway to the dead end road on R.A. Nursery Road the Committee recommended approval of the variance. This request would not interfere with the traffic on the road.

There was no further discussion on this item.

Commissioner Stamper stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

# **Subject: Information Technology – Second Reading and Approval of Administrative Authority to Purchase Equipment from Cooperative Contracts**

Commissioner Elkin moved to approve the request from Information Technology for the Administrative Authority to purchase laptop computers, personal computers, peripherals and printers from cooperative contracts for the fiscal year 2003.
