BID AWARD RECOMMENDATION

BID #47-07JUL05 - Northern Boone County Bridge Projects & BID #48-07JUL05 - Southern Boone County Bridge Projects

The Public Works Department recommends award of the **Northern Boone County Bridge Projects** contract and the **Southern Boone County Projects** contract to **Widel, Inc.**, the low bidder for both contracts.

Bid amounts exceed the budgeted amounts by \$22,902.00 for the Northern Bridges and \$ 25,383.00 for the Southern Bridges. (A summary of the budgeted amounts verses the bid amounts is attached.) One option is to reject all bids, modify the plans, and rebid the project. However, I do not recommend this option for the following reasons:

- I feel that there are no bid items that can be eliminated from the contract to reduce the cost. Everything in the plans and specifications are necessary for the proper completion of these projects. (No extras were included.)
- Due to the current economy, increased fuel costs, increased material costs, increased prevailing wage rates, etc.; nearly all bids for public sector projects this year have been over budget. Therefore, I do not feel that rebidding at a later date will result in a lower cost and will more likely result in a higher cost.
- Re-bidding will delay the start of construction and these projects will not be completed within the 2006 construction season.

If awarded I propose that the additional costs be offset by adjustments within the current budget (See attachment)

Another concern is the question of the contractor's intent and capability of completing both contracts within the specified time frame. (All 7 bridges completed by the end of the year.) I spoke with Elizabeth Widel 7/8/05 and Milton Thornas at Widel, Inc. on 7/11/05 and confirmed that it is their intention to accept and complete both contracts as specified. They will dedicate two separate crews with two separate cranes and complete both contracts concurrently. Based on this response, I feel we must proceed with the award of these contracts. I think that you would agree that to not award to the low bidder based on speculation that the contractor cannot fulfill the terms of the contract will put us at risk of lawsuit. (Please let me know if you do not agree with this.) My opinion is that when the contractor is willing to accept the terms of the contract, and they have demonstrated the experience necessary to complete the scope of work specified, we have an obligation to award the contract to them unless they have been formally banned from bidding work due to unsatisfactory performance and/ or completion of a previous contract. Although this Department has documented safety and workmanship concerns about Widel, Inc.'s construction of previous projects, no formal action was taken to bar them from bidding on future contracted work. We must rely on the Contracts and Performance Bonds as our assurance that the projects are completed as specified.

It is understood and agreed that, except as may be otherwise provided for by the "General Specifications, and "Technical Specifications," and "Special Provisions" the work shall be done in accordance with the "Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 1999", a copy of which can be obtained from the State of Missouri, Missouri

Highway and Transportation Division in Jefferson City, Missouri. Said Specifications are part and parcel of this contract, and are incorporated in this contract as fully and effectively as if set forth in detail herein.

The Contractor further agrees that he is fully informed regarding all of the conditions affecting the work to be done, and labor and materials to be furnished for the completion of this contract, and that his information was secured by personal investigation and research and not from any estimates of the Owner; and that he will make no claim against the Owner by reason of estimates, tests, or representation of any officer, agent, or employees of the Owner.

The said Contractor agrees further to begin work not later than the authorized date in the Notice to Proceed, and to complete the work within the time specified in the contract documents or such additional time as may be allowed by the Engineer under the contract.

The work shall be done to complete satisfaction of the Owner and, in the case the Federal Government or any agency thereof is participating in the payment of the cost of construction of the work, the work shall also be subject to inspection and approval at all times by the proper agent or officials of such government agency.

The parties hereto agree that this contract in all things shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missoun.

Contractor agrees it will pay not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages to all workers performing work under the contract in accordance with the prevailing wage determination issued by the Division of Labor Standards of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations for the State of Missouri and as maintained on file with the Boone County Public Works Department.

The Contractor further agrees that it shall forfeit as a penalty to the County of Boone the sum of \$10.00 for each worker employed for each calendar day or portion thereof such worker is paid less than the stipulated rates set forth in the prevailing wage determination for the project for any work done under this contract by the Contractor or by any Subcontractor employed by the Contractor pursuant to the provisions of Section 290.250 RSMo. The Contractor further agrees that it will abide by all provisions of the prevailing wage law as set forth in Chapter 290 RSMo. and rules and regulations issued thereunder and that any penalties assessed may be withheld from sums due to the Contractor by the Owner.

The contractor agrees that he will comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations and ordinances and that he/she will comply and cause each of his/her subcontractors, and directives pertaining to nondiscrimination against any person on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in connection with this contract, including procurement of materials and lease of equipment; therefore, in accordance with the special provisions on that subject attached hereto, incorporated in and made a part of the Contract.

The Contractor expressly warrants that he/she has employed no third person to solicit or obtain this contract in his behalf, or to cause or procure the same to be obtained upon compensation in any way contingent, in whole or in part, upon such procurement; and that he has not paid, or promised or agreed to pay to any third person, in consideration of such procurement, or in compensation for services in connection therewith, any brokerage, commission or percentage upon the amount receivable by him hereunder; and that he has not, in estimating the contract price demand by him, included any sum by reason of such brokerage, commission, or percentage; and that all moneys payable to him hereunder are free from obligation of any other person for services rendered, or supposed to have been rendered, in the procurement of this contract. He further agrees that any breach of this warranty shall constitute adequate cause for the annulment of this contract by the Owner, and that the Owner may retain to its own use from any sums due to or to become due hereunder an amount equal to any brokerage, commission, or percentage so paid, or agreed to be paid.

BID AWARD RECOMMENDATION

BID #47-07JUL05 - Northern Boone County Bridge Projects & BID #48-07JUL05 - Southern Boone County Bridge Projects

The Public Works Department recommends award of the Northern Boone County Bridge Projects contract and the Southern Boone County Projects contract to Widel, Inc., the low bidder for both contracts.

Bid amounts exceed the budgeted amounts by \$22,902.00 for the Northern Bridges and \$ 25,383.00 for the Southern Bridges. (A summary of the budgeted amounts verses the bid amounts is attached.) One option is to reject all bids, modify the plans, and rebid the project. However, I do not recommend this option for the following reasons:

- I feel that there are no bid items that can be eliminated from the contract to reduce the cost. Everything
 in the plans and specifications are necessary for the proper completion of these projects. (No extras
 were included.)
- Due to the current economy, increased fuel costs, increased material costs, increased prevailing wage rates, etc.; nearly all bids for public sector projects this year have been over budget. Therefore, I do not feel that rebidding at a later date will result in a lower cost and will more likely result in a higher cost.
- Re-bidding will delay the start of construction and these projects will not be completed within the 2006 construction season.

If awarded I propose that the additional costs be offset by adjustments within the current budget (See attachment)

Another concern is the question of the contractor's intent and capability of completing both contracts within the specified time frame. (All 7 bridges completed by the end of the year.) I spoke with Elizabeth Widel 7/8/05 and Milton Thomas at Widel, Inc. on 7/11/05 and confirmed that it is their intention to accept and complete both contracts as specified. They will dedicate two separate crews with two separate cranes and complete both contracts concurrently. Based on this response, I feel we must proceed with the award of these contracts. I think that you would agree that to not award to the low bidder based on speculation that the contractor cannot fulfill the terms of the contract will put us at risk of lawsuit. (Please let me know if you do not agree with this.) My opinion is that when the contractor is willing to accept the terms of the contract, and they have demonstrated the experience necessary to complete the scope of work specified, we have an obligation to award the contract to them unless they have been formally banned from bidding work due to unsatisfactory performance and/ or completion of a previous contract. Although this Department has documented safety and workmanship concerns about Widel, Inc.'s construction of previous projects, no formal action was taken to bar them from bidding on future contracted work. We must rely on the Contracts and Performance Bonds as our assurance that the projects are completed as specified.

This contract will be paid out of department 2045 – Public Works Design and Construction, account number 71100 – Outside Services. The original budget was \$75,000.00. BID #50-19JUL05 - Soft Pit Hill Road Improvement Project

The Public Works Department recommends award of the Soft Pit Hill Road Improvement Project contract to the low bidder Boone Construction Company.

The Construction bid amount exceeds the budgeted amount by \$4,472.65 for this project, and other costs have been incurred to relocate a utility pole and satisfy wetlands mitigation requirements that total \$20,151.62. This will bring total project cost to \$99,624.27. One option is to reject all bids, modify the plans, and rebid the project. However, I do not recommend this option for the following reasons:

- I feel that there are no bid items that can be eliminated from the contract to reduce the cost. Everything
 in the plans and specifications are necessary for the proper completion of these projects. (No extras
 were included.)
- Due to the current economy, increased fuel costs, increased material costs, increased prevailing wage
 rates, etc.; nearly all bids for public sector projects this year have been over budget. Therefore, I do not
 feel that rebidding at a later date will result in a lower cost and will more likely result in a higher cost.
- Re-bidding will delay the start of construction and these projects will not be completed within the 2006 construction season.

If awarded I propose that the additional costs be offset by adjustments within the current budget. (See attachment.)



The Governor has signed the following three bills with language (same or similar in each) affecting NIDs administration: CCS SS SCS HCS HB 58, CCS HCS SS SCS SB 210, and SS SCS HCS HB 186. The sections changed relating to NIDs are: 67.459, 67.469, 140.150 & 140.160. See the bills for specific language.

Following is a summary of changes by section:

- 67.459
 - O Adds that expenses of the benefit are to be assessed proportionately to each unit of a condominium or equitable owner association ownership
- 67.469
 - O Lien on special assessment (NID) may be foreclosed in the same manner as tax upon real property by land tax sale or, by judicial foreclosure <u>at the option of the governing body</u>
 - O Upon foreclosure of the lien, the entire remaining assessment <u>may</u> (changed from shall) be recoverable <u>at the option of the governing body</u>
- 140.150
 - o Adds NID special assessment to tax sale law
- 140.160
 - O Adds NIDs billings to tax sale law requirement of selling (foreclosing) within 3 years after delinquency I do two years in Boone County.

My recommendations:

• We should continue to foreclose through the tax sale process rather than the judicial process. Procedures are already in place, the time lines are clearly established and it is much less expensive. In most instances both the real estate and NID bills will be delinquent and foreclosure through the tax sale for the real estate bills will already be occurring.

- We should foreclosure on the entire remaining unpaid assessment. If we do not foreclose on the entire remaining unpaid assessment, and a collector's deed is subsequently issued, the county's lien on the property could be extinguished. There is great potential any balance due would not be collectible.
- The petition to create a NID and/or the commission order to proceed should specify that in the case of foreclosure for non-payment of the annual billings, the property will be sold through the tax sale process.

I am requesting the Commission issue an order to address the legislative changes as per my recommendations.

The following ARTICLE I through XVII are required by MoDOT for BRO Projects and made part of the Engineering Services Contract.

ARTICLE I - SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. DESIGN PHASE - The Engineer will:

- 1. Determine the needs of the Local Agency for the project;
- 2. Conduct topographic, property and utility surveys sufficient to develop plans for the project;
- 3. Arrange for subsurface investigations if needed;
- 4. Conduct hydraulic studies, prepare alternative designs and cost estimates, develop preliminary plans, and recommend to the Local Agency the best overall general design based on these studies;
- 5. Submit four copies of preliminary plans, estimates and studies for review by the Local Agency and Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT);
- 6. Based on approvals of preliminary plans, prepare detailed construction plans, cost estimates, specifications and related documents as necessary for the purpose of soliciting bids for constructing the project. Provision will be made in the contract documents for that portion of the work that will be performed by Local Agency's forces;
- 7. Where required, bridge structures will be designed in accordance with the Guide Specification for Seismic Design of Highway Bridges, as published by the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials;
- 8. Secure adequate property title information, determine right-of-way requirements, prepare right-of-way plans, and assist the Local Agency in acquiring the right-of-way deeds needed for the project;
- 9. Ensure compliance with water quality requirements by coordinating with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and also ensure compliance with the requirements of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA);
- 10. Ensure compliance with historic preservation requirements through coordination with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, and if deemed necessary, arrange to have the site examined by a qualified archaeologist on a subcontract basis;
- 11. Ensure compliance with all regulations in regards to noise abatement and air quality, if necessary; and
- 12. Provide the Local Agency with five sets of completed plans, specifications and cost estimates for the purpose of obtaining construction authorization from the Missouri Department of Transportation.

B. BIDDING PHASE - The Engineer will:

- 1. Upon receipt of construction authorization from MoDOT, make final corrections resulting from reviews by agencies involved, and provide an adequate number of plans, specifications, and bid documents to the Local Agency;
- Provide the Local Agency with a list of qualified area bidders and assist Local Agency in advertising for bids;
- 3. Assist the Local Agency in evaluating bids and requesting concurrence in award from MoDOT;
- C. CONSTRUCTION PHASE The Engineer will serve as the Local Agency's representative for administering the terms of the construction contract between Local Agency and their Contractor. Engineer will endeavor to protect the Local Agency against defects and deficiencies in workmanship and materials in work by the Contractor. However, the furnishing of such project representation will not make Engineer responsible for the construction methods and procedures used by the Contractor or for the Contractor's failure to perform work in accordance with the contract documents. Engineer's services will include more specifically as follows:
 - 1. Assist the Local Agency with a preconstruction conference to discuss project details with the Contractor;

- Make periodic site visits to observe the Contractor's progress and quality of work, and to determine if the
 work conforms to the contract documents. It is contemplated that survey staking and layout will be
 accomplished by the contractor's forces. The Engineer will accompany MoDOT and FHWA representatives
 on visits of the project site as requested;
- 3. Check shop drawings and review schedules and drawings submitted by the Contractor;
- 4. Reject work not conforming to the project documents;
- 5. Prepare change orders for issuance by the Local Agency as necessary and assure that proper approvals are made prior to work being performed;
- 6. Review wage rates, postings, equal employment opportunity and other related items called for in the contract documents;
- 7. Inspect materials, review material certifications furnished by Contractor, sample concrete and other materials as required, and arrange for laboratory testing of samples by others on a subcontract basis. Independent assurance samples and tests will be performed by MoDOT personnel and such sampling and testing is excluded from the work to be performed by the Engineer under this contract;
- 8. Maintain progress diary and other project records, measure and document quantities, and prepare monthly estimates for payments due the Contractor;
- 9. Be present during critical construction operations, including but not limited to the following:
 - Structure layout;
 - b. Excavation and backfilling;
 - c. Driving of piles;
 - d. Checking of reinforcing steel prior to concrete placement;
 - e. Concrete batching and pouring;
 - f. Placement of girders; and
 - g. Placement of surfacing materials; and
- 10. Participate in final inspection, provide the Local Agency with project documentation (diaries, test results, certifications, etc.), and provide as-built plans for the Local Agency's records.

ARTICLE II - ADDITIONAL SERVICES

The Local Agency reserves the right to request additional work, and changed or unforeseen conditions may require changes and work beyond the scope of this contract. In this event, a supplement to this agreement shall be executed and submitted for the approval by MoDOT prior to performing the additional or changed work or incurring any additional cost thereof. Any change in compensation will be covered in the supplement.

ARTICLE III - RESPONSIBILITIES OF LOCAL AGENCY

The Local Agency will cooperate fully with the Engineer in the development of the project, including the following:

- A. Make available all information pertaining to the project which may be in the possession of the Local Agency;
- B. Provide the Engineer with the Local Agency's requirements for the project;
- C. Make provisions for the Engineer to enter upon property at the project site for the performance of his duties;
- D. Examine all studies and layouts developed by the Engineer, obtain reviews by MoDOT, and render decisions thereon in a prompt manner so as not to delay the Engineer;
- E. Designate a person in the Local Agency's employ to act as Local Agency's representative under this contract, such person to have authority to transmit instructions, interpret the Local Agency's policies and render decisions with respect to matters covered by this agreement;
- F. Perform appraisals and appraisal review, negotiate with property owners and otherwise provide all services in connection with acquiring all right-of-way needed to construct this project; and
- G. Furnish an inspector to observe the contractor's day-to-day operations.

ARTICLE IV - PERIOD OF SERVICE (*See first page of contract for schedules)

The Engineer will commence work within two weeks after receiving notice to proceed from the Local Agency. The general phases of work will be completed in accordance with the following schedule:

- A. Preliminary Design Phase Within ** calendar days after receipt of notice to proceed;
- B. Final Design Phase Within * calendar days after completion of review of preliminary plans by Local Agency and MoDOT; and
- C. Construction Phase As desired by the Local Agency and on a schedule so as not to delay the Contractor. All services under this contract will be completed 30 days after final acceptance of construction work.

The above times are exclusive of review time by other agencies and exclusive of time needed to acquire right-of-way. The Local Agency will grant time extensions for unavoidable delays beyond the control of the Engineer. Requests for extensions of time should be requested in writing by the Engineer, stating fully the reasons for the request.

ARTICLE V - STANDARDS

Design criteria and project planning will be in accordance with Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Bridges and A Policy on Geometric Design of Highways and Systems as promulgated by the American Association of Highway and Transportation Officials and as contained in the Local Public Agency Manual. The latest version of Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction will be used for contract specifications, with appropriate modifications thereto by the Engineer.

ARTICLE VI - COMPENSATION (*See first page of contract for fees)

For services provided under this contract, the Local Agency will compensate the Engineer as follows: (choose one)

- A. For design services, including work through the construction contract award stage, the Local Agency will pay the Engineer the actual costs incurred plus a predetermined fixed fee of \$\frac{\structure{\struc
- B. For construction inspection services, the Local Agency will pay the Engineer the actual costs incurred plus a predetermined fixed fee of \(\frac{\strack{\general}}{\strack{\general}} \), with a ceiling established for said inspection services in the amount of \(\frac{\strack{\general}}{\strack{\general}} \), which amount shall not be exceeded.
- C. The compensation outlined above has been derived from estimates of cost which are detailed in Attachment A. Any major changes in work, extra work, exceeding of the contract ceiling, or change in the predetermined fixed fee will require a supplement to this contract, as covered in Article II ADDITIONAL SERVICES.
- D. Actual costs in Sections A and B above are defined as:
 - 1. Actual payroll salaries paid to employees for time that they are productively engaged in work covered by this contract, plus 146.0% for overhead of which,
 - 2. An amount estimated at 70% of actual salaries in Item 1 above for payroll additives, including payroll taxes, holiday and vacation pay, sick leave pay, insurance benefits, retirement and incentive pay, plus;
 - 3. An amount estimated at 76.0% of actual salaries in Item 1 above for general administrative overhead, based on the Engineer's system for allocating indirect costs in accordance with sound accounting principles and business practice, plus;
 - 4. Other costs directly attributable to the project but not included in the above overhead, such as vehicle mileage, meals and lodging, printing, surveying expendables, and computer time, plus;
 - 5. Project costs incurred by others on a subcontract basis, said costs to be passed through the Engineer on the basis of reasonable and actual cost as invoiced by the subcontractors.
- E. The rates shown for additives and overhead in Sections VI. D.2 and VI D.3 above are approximate and will be used for interim billing purposes. Final payment will be based on the actual rates experienced during the period of performance, as indicated by the Engineer's accounting records, and as determined by final audit of the Engineer's records by MoDOT.
- F. The payment of costs under this contract will be limited to costs which are allowable under 23 CRF Part 172 and 48 CFR Part 31.

- G. METHOD OF PAYMENT Partial payments for work satisfactorily completed will be made to the Engineer upon receipt of itemized invoices by the Local Agency. Invoices will be submitted no more frequently than one invoice per month. A pro-rated portion of the fixed fee will be paid with each invoice.
- H. PROPERTY ACCOUNTABILITY If it becomes necessary to acquire any specialized equipment for the performance of this contract, appropriate credit will be given for any residual value of said equipment after completion of usage of the equipment.

ARTICLE VII - COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES

The Engineer warrants that he has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working for the Engineer, to solicit or secure this agreement, and that he has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts, or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this contract. For breach or violation of this warranty, the Local Agency shall have the right to annul this agreement without liability, or in its discretion to deduct from the contract price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee, plus reasonable attorney's fees.

ARTICLE VIII - SUBLETTING, ASSIGNMENT OR TRANSFER

No portion of the work covered by this contract, except as provided herein, shall be sublet or transferred without the written consent of the Local Agency. The subletting of the work shall in no way relieve the Engineer of his primary responsibility for the quality and performance of the work. It is the intention of the Engineer to engage subcontractors for the purposes of services, such as surveying, foundation borings and tests, abstracts of title, archaeological studies, material testing.

ARTICLE IX - PROFESSIONAL ENDORSEMENT

All plans, specifications and other documents shall be endorsed by the Engineer and shall reflect the name and seal of the Professional Engineer endorsing the work.

ARTICLE X - RETENTION OF RECORDS

The Engineer shall maintain all records, survey notes, design documents, cost and accounting records, construction records and other records pertaining to this contract and to the project covered by this contract, for a period of three years after the consultant receives payment of their final invoice from the Local Agency. Said records shall be made available for inspection by authorized representatives of the Local Agency, MoDOT or the federal government during regular working hours at the Engineer's place of business.

ARTICLE XI - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Plans, tracings, maps and specifications prepared under this contract shall be delivered to and become the property of the Local Agency upon termination or completion of work. Basic survey notes, design computations and other data prepared under this contract shall be made available to the Local Agency upon request. All such information produced under this contract shall be available for use by the Local Agency without restriction or limitation on its use. If the Local Agency incorporates any portion of the work into a project other than that for which it was performed, the Local Agency shall save the Engineer harmless from any claims and liabilities resulting from such use.

ARTICLE XII- TERMINATION

The Local Agency may terminate the contract at any time by giving written notice. If the contract is terminated because the project is abandoned or postponed by the Local Agency, the Engineer will be paid for actual expenses incurred up to the date of termination, plus a pro-rated portion of the fixed fee.

If the contract is terminated due to the Engineer's services being unsatisfactory in the judgment of the Local Agency, or if the Engineer fails to prosecute the work with due diligence, the Local Agency may procure completion of the work in such manner as it deems to be in the best interest of the Local Agency. The Engineer will be responsible for any excess cost in addition to that provided for in this contract or any damages the Local Agency may sustain by reason of the termination of this contract due to unsatisfactory performances or prosecution.

ARTICLE XIII - DECISIONS UNDER THIS CONTRACT

The Local Agency will determine the acceptability of work performed under this contract, and will decide all questions which may arise concerning the project. The Local Agency's decision shall be final and conclusive.

ARTICLE XIV - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

The Local Agency and the Engineer agree that this contract and all contracts entered into under the provisions of this contract shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns.

ARTICLE XV - COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Engineer shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the work, including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and non-discrimination clauses incorporated herein, and shall procure all licenses and permits necessary for the fulfillment of obligations under this contract.

ARTICLE XVI - RESPONSIBILITY FOR CLAIMS AND LIABILITY

The Engineer agrees to save harmless the Local Agency, MoDOT and FHWA from all claims and liability due to his negligent acts or the negligent acts of his employees, agents or subcontractors.

ARTICLE XVII - NONDISCRIMINATION

The Engineer, with regard to the work performed by it after award and prior to completion of the contract work, will not discriminate on the ground of race, color or national origin in the selection and retention of subcontractors. The Engineer will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended. More specifically, the Engineer will comply with the regulations of the Department of Transportation relative to nondiscrimination in federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, as contained in 49 CFR 21 through Appendix H and 23 CFR 710.405 which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract. In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Engineer for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurement of materials or equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the Engineer's obligations under this contract and the regulations relative to non-discrimination on the ground of color, race or national origin.



ATTACHMENT C

CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES -- PRIMARY COVERED TRANSACTION

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CERTIFICATION

- 1. By signing and submitting this proposal, the prospective primary participant is providing the certification set out below.
- 2. The inability of a person to provide the certification required below will not necessarily result in denial of participation in this covered transaction. The prospective participant shall submit an explanation of why it cannot provide the certification set out below. The certification or explanation will be considered in connection with the department or agency's determination whether to enter into this transaction. However, failure of the prospective primary participant to furnish a certification or an explanation shall disqualify such person from participation in this transaction.
- 3. The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when the department or agency determined to enter into this transaction. If it is later determined that the prospective primary participant knowingly rendered an erroneous certification in addition to other remedies available to the Federal Government, the department or agency may terminate this transaction for cause of default.

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES BY AND BETWEEN

BOONE COUNTY

AND

THE MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

CONTRACT NO. #06-27

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this // day of // day of // 2005 by and between BOONE COUNTY, Missouri (hereinafter called the "county"), and the DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, (Director of the Department of Natural Resources, Director of Division of Geology and Land Survey, and State Land Surveyor) hereinafter called the "Department."

WHEREAS, the County desires to engage the Department to render certain services hereafter described in connection with delineation of section and quarter section corners of the United States Public Land Survey and known as the County Surveyor Cooperative Remonumentation Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

- 1. <u>EMPLOYMENT OF COUNTY SURVEYOR.</u> The County hereby agrees to engage the County Surveyor to perform the services hereinafter set forth.
- 2. <u>SCOPE OF SERVICES.</u> The County Surveyor will remonument corners of the United States Public Land Survey, satisfying one of the following descriptions:
 - A. An original corner established by the original government surveyors under contract from the General Land Office or its successors in title, for which sufficient original evidence exists to definitely locate the position of said corner.
 - B. A perpetuated corner for which the records by county or other surveyors positively show that subsequent witness marks were placed and/or perpetuated when there was still positive evidence of the original witness marks identifying the corner placed by the original government surveyors, and provided the chain of perpetuation is not broken and evidence of the perpetuation exists.
 - C. A poorly monumented and/or documented corner whose basis for remonumentation is its long use and acceptance by local residents as the government corner, and/or its general agreement with the GLO survey in the area. Long usage is at least 20 years of undisputed use.
 - D. A county surveyor may make application for remonumentation of a corner that has been reestablished if there is record documentation verifying the twenty (20) year period, the corner is not in conflict with another corner, and the corner was reestablished by a county surveyor in accordance with the procedures outlined in the Missouri statutes for the reestablishment of a lost corner.
- 3. <u>PUBLIC NOTICE.</u> The County Commission shall publish a notice once each week for three consecutive weeks in some newspaper of general circulation published in the county. The County shall furnish the Department with a publication affidavit verifying the advertisement. The form of the notice is as follows:

"The following corners of the Original United States Public Land Survey will be remonumented. Any citizen wishing to file objections to the remonumentation of the existing corner marker shall do so with the State Land Surveyor, PO Box 250, Rolla, Missouri 65402 within 30 days."

(List of corners - to be furnished by the Department)

- 4. <u>INVESTIGATION OF OBJECTION TO REMONUMENTATION.</u> The State Land Surveyor shall investigate all objections to remonumentation and his decision will be final.
- 5. <u>DEPARTMENT TO FURNISH MONUMENTS.</u> The Department will furnish the County Surveyor with all necessary material (monuments, witness signs, posts and tree tags) required for remonumentation.

6. PROCEDURE.

- A. The county surveyor must meet the following deadlines in performing the work under this contract:
 - Submit to the Department of Natural Resources an application for remonumentation (partially completed Certified Land Corner Restoration Form) on each corner on or before <u>September 30, 2005</u>. The Department of Natural Resources will approve or disapprove within 30 days, and designate any corners required to be tied to the Missouri Coordinate System 1983.
 - 2) Start public notice publication on or before December 1, 2005;
 - 3) The remonumentation can begin when submitted corners have been approved and monuments delivered to the county surveyor;
 - 4) Submit completed Certified Land Corner Restoration Forms on or before March 1, 2006. The Department of Natural Resources will approve or disapprove the forms within 30 days; and
 - 5) Make any corrections to monumentation or forms and resubmit along with an invoice to the county on or before <u>May 1, 2006</u>. Failure to meet the above deadlines shall, at the option of the Department, be cause for termination of this contract after the County is duly notified in writing.
- B. Prior to the public notice and remonumentation, the County Surveyor will submit to the State Land Surveyor for his approval on each corner, a copy of a partially completed Certified Land Corner Restoration form containing the following information:
 - Description of the original monument and accessories including the book and page reference;
 - 2) a) Sufficient information to show justification of longstanding use by subsequent surveys (including book and page reference);
 - b) Sufficient information to show justification of longstanding use by local residents and measurements to show agreement with the GLO survey of the area; or
 - c) Sufficient information to show the corner meets the requirements of 2D.
 - 3) Description of corner evidence found;
 - 4) Sketch of corner, showing sufficient information to locate the corner position in the field, and a recommendation of the type and placement of monument and reference marks to be set.
- C. Upon approval and notification by the State Land Surveyor, the county court will publish a notice as described in paragraph 3 of this agreement.
- D. The County Surveyor may start remonumentation of those corners listed in the public notice with the type of monument approved by the State Land Surveyor upon receipt of the approved list of corners. Remonumentation shall be in accordance with the Department of Natural Resources' <u>Specifications for Perpetuation of the Original United States Public Land Survey Corners.</u>
- E. Upon completion of remonumentation the County Surveyor shall submit to the State Land Surveyor for approval, completed original Certified Land Corner Restoration forms on each corner monumented. All information will be typed or completed in black ink. Lettering or typing shall not be less than 8 point. In addition to the information required in 6B above, the form shall contain a description of the monument and accessories established to perpetuate the location of the corner. A sketch of the corner will be provided on the back of the form.
- F. Upon approval by the State Land Surveyor of the remonumentation and Certified Land Corner Restoration forms, reimbursement by the Department shall be made as outlined in paragraph 11 below.

- 7. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT CAUSE. If through any reasonable cause, the Department cannot fulfill its obligation under this contract, or if the County cannot for any reasonable cause fulfill its obligation, this contract can be terminated. In the event either party finds it necessary to request a cancellation such fact will be revealed without delay so that as much time as possible can be devoted to a settlement. Every effort will be made to prevent loss to the County or the Department.
- 8. <u>CHANGES.</u> The County or Department may, from time to time, require changes in the scope of services and the time of performance hereunder. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of compensation, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the County and the Department, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this contract.
- 9. <u>GOVERNING LAW.</u> This contract shall be interpreted under and governed by the laws of the State of Missouri.
- 10. <u>REIMBURSEMENT BY THE COUNTY</u>. The County agrees to reimburse the County Surveyor for his services rendered by the terms of this contract.
- 11. <u>REIMBURSEMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT.</u> The Department will reimburse the county \$200.00 for each corner remonumented not having a valid objection and remonumented in accordance with this agreement. The County will submit to the Department an invoice for these services along with a copy of the County Surveyor's invoice to the county. THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE OVERALL MAXIMUM OF \$2,000.00 FOR TEN (10) CORNERS.
- 12. CONTRACT PERIOD. This contract shall expire on: June 1, 2006.


