Subject: Authorize the Presiding Commissioner to sign the Federal Annual Certification Reports

Sheriff Boehm stated that the Sheriff's Department has to report to the federal government the money that is received through Federal Forfeiture Funds and list how all of those funds are spent. He stated that this document includes a line-item expense report.

Commissioner Stamper moved to authorize the Presiding Commissioner to sign the Federal Annual Certification Reports.

Commissioner Vogt seconded the motion.

There was no discussion.

The motion passed 3-0. Order 36-2000

Subject: Inmate Work Program

Sheriff Boehm stated that the Boone County Jail currently has 24 inmates that perform various jobs inside of or for the Jail facility. He stated that due to the increase in inmates and longer sentences, the Sheriff's Department would like to establish a program to take 8 inmates off the grounds to perform various services for not-for-profit agencies such as the Central Missouri Food Bank, Boone County Fairgrounds, etc. He stated that the inmates could perform work such as helping to maintain Union Cemetery, maintenance of soccer fields, etc. He stated that in 1996 and 1998 the inmates put up the City of Columbia Downtown Christmas lights. He stated that the program would accept work from any not-for-profit organization.

Sheriff Boehm stated that they hoped to be able to work with the Circuit Court to reduce the sentences of those inmates who participate in the program.

Commissioner Stamper asked about the liability aspects of the program.

Sheriff Boehm stated that this type of program (on a minimal scale) has been in effect for a long time. He stated that the inmates would not receive any type of monetary compensation for their work.

Commissioner Miller asked Sheriff Boehm if he had discussed the program with the Circuit Court to find out if they would be interested.

Sheriff Boehm stated that the Sheriff's Department has a Work Release (sentence reduction) Program in place. He stated that the Circuit Court is interested in programs such as these.

Commissioner Stamper stated that, cost-wise, this type of program would be of significant benefit to the community.

Sheriff Boehm stated that they would start the program with male inmates, but would try females at a later date if the program were to be successful.

Commissioner Vogt reiterated that the work involved in this program would not take jobs away from other people in the community. She stated that the work would be volunteer-type of activity for not-for-profit organizations.

Commissioner Vogt asked Sheriff Boehm to state what the criteria would be for selecting an inmate to be in the program.

Sheriff Boehm stated that they would examine the type of crime that the person is incarcerated for. He stated that the list of inmates would be reviewed with the Prosecuting Attorney's Office to see if there would be a potential threat in having the person out in the community.

Commissioner Miller stated that this could also aid the inmates in their life skills. She stated that it could be of benefit for the inmates to have to go to work everyday and maintain an 8-hr work schedule.

Commissioner Miller asked if there were any criteria for the selection of the not-for-profit groups that the inmates would work for.

Sheriff Boehm stated that the criteria would be for the organization to be a not-for-profit group.

Commissioner Stamper stated that he sensed good enthusiasm from the Commission for this program. He stated that they applauded the Sheriff's efforts on this program. He stated that he would mention the program to County Counsel John Patton to see if there were liability issues that needed to be addressed.

Commissioner Stamper

Commissioner Stamper reported that he has been working on the Windy Point matter. He stated that Stan Shawver would bring forward a list of possible conditions at the Monday, Adjourned Term County Commission meeting. He noted that the list would be forwarded to the applicant in the meantime.

Commissioner Miller reported that she attended the Soil & Water Conservation meeting this morning. She stated that S & W is sponsoring an Agricultural Land Seminar on March 16th. She stated that there would be various speakers promoting farmland protection and preservation. She stated that the entire program would help the community understand what is possible as far as preserving farmland space is concerned.
