A. 48-13SEP00 Classification Position Pay Plan Study

Marlene Ridgway presented the following recommendation:

On September 13, 2000 the County of Boone accepted six proposals for the above referenced services. These were submitted by Public Sector Personnel Consultants from Chicago, IL, Hay Group, Inc. from Kansas City, MO; DMG Maximus, Madison, WI; Deliotte and Touche, Detroit, MI; AAIM Management Association, St. Louis; and Brennan, Thomsen Associates, Inc. Chesterfield, MO. The evaluation committee consisting of Commissioner Karen M. Miller, Sheriff Ted Boehm, Auditor June Pitchford, Recorder Bettie Johnson, Human Resources Director Betty Dickneite, Treasurer Kay Murray and myself.

Each firm was ranked on the following criteria:

- Previous Experience
- Skill, experience and time commitments to performing services,
- Respondents understanding county requirements, and
- Other information provided in the responses

Upon the completion of separate proposal evaluations the committee chose Public Sector Personnel Consultants as having submitted the proposal receiving the highest rankings based on the content of their response.

The evaluation committee would like to recommend to the County Commission that the above referenced contract be awarded to Public Sector Personnel Consultants as having presented the response best fitting the needs of the County of Boone. The cost of this contract should not exceed \$55,000.

Commissioner Vogt moved to award bid 48-13SEP00 as follows:

B. Yr 2001 Highway Patrol Vehicles

Marlene Ridgway presented the following recommendation:

The State contract for the purchase of Highway Patrol Y r 2001 Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptors has been awarded to Joe Machens Ford of Columbia. The Sheriff's Department has budgeted for the purchase of eight of these vehicles in 2000. We are requesting approval from the County Commission to proceed with a purchase from the State of Missouri Cooperative Contract Number C101029001. The unit cost for the base vehicle and appropriate add alternates are \$20,968 with a total contract value of \$167,744.

The State has also made an award for Yr 2001 Chevrolet Impala 9C1 Police Package Patrol Cars to Don Brown Chevrolet. The Sheriff's Department has budgeted for the purchase of two of these vehicles in 2000. We are requesting approval from the County Commission to proceed with a purchase from the State of Missouri Cooperative Contract Number C101029002. The total contract value for this purchase is \$38,650.

Total cost of all vehicles is \$206,394 and to be paid out of organization 1251 account 92400. The Sheriff's Department has budgeted \$220,000.

Commissioner Vogt moved to approve the request to proceed with the purchase of Model Year 2001 Highway Patrol Vehicles from the State of MO Cooperative Contracts Number C101029001 and C101029002 as outlined on the attached memorandum from the Purchasing Department. It is further ordered that the Presiding Commissioner be hereby authorized to sign the agreements.

Commissioner Miller seconded the motion.

There was no discussion.

C. Rescind Commission Order 424-2000 and authorize use of City of Columbia contract 206-98 with Cargill Inc. for Sodium Chloride Term and Supply

Marlene Ridgway presented the following recommendation:

We request to rescind Commission order 424-2000 due to an error in the information given to me and retained in the contract. This was not a cooperative contract and should not have been awarded. The vendor has not signed the contract and it is not in force.

We further request your approval to "piggyback" off of the City of Columbia contact #206/98 with Cargill, Inc. We have contacted this vendor to see if they would agree to enter into an agreement with Boone County under the same terms and conditions. The price per ton is \$29.57 delivered.

This is a Term and Supply contract, hence no need for Purchase Orders.

If the County Commission agrees with this purchase a contract is provided for signatures.

Commissioner Miller moved to rescind Commission Order 424-2000 and approve the request by the Purchasing Department to establish a Sodium Chloride Term and Supply Contract with Cargill, Inc. utilizing the City of Columbia contract 206/98. It is further ordered that the Presiding Commissioner be hereby authorized to sign the agreement.

Commissioner Vogt seconded the motion.

Discussion: Commissioner Miller stated that this represented a significant difference in the cost.

Marlene Ridgway stated that the cost was about \$2.20 more per ton.

D. 56-15NOV00 Bank Stabilization and Erosion Control Measures

Marlene Ridgway presented the following recommendation:

The department and I have reviewed the responses submitted for the Bank Stabilization and Erosion Control Measures and we recommend awarding the bid to C. L. Richardson for having the lowest and best bid meeting the minimum specifications.

Total cost for this project is \$95,928.50 and to be paid out of organization 2045 account 71100. The budgeted amount for this project is \$100,000.

Marlene Ridgway stated that this is approximately \$2.20 more per ton.

Subject: Budget Revision for Out of County Housing

Major Warren Brewer presented the County Commission with out of County housing figures from Jan. 1 2000 to the present.

Commissioner Miller noted that the number of inmates being housed out of County decreased temporarily after the renovation and expansion. She stated that now however the number has increased again.

Commissioner Miller asked how hard it is to find bed space (out of County).

Major Warren Brewer stated that at present it is relatively easy to find bed space. He stated that a private company opened a new facility that has opened up outside of Sedalia, MO.

Major Warren Brewer stated in response to a comment by Commissioner Vogt that most Counties prefer to house inmates that are not on medication or on commit status. He stated that a number of the individuals "that are of a behavior pattern or classification that is conducive to a learning environment are the first ones that are sent of out County and therefore are not able to receive the educational opportunities." He stated that this is an unfortunate situation. He stated that he also has sympathy for those individuals that are unable to receive visits from their families because they are housed out of County.

Major Warren Brewer stated that the Court en Banc has denied the Sheriff's Department's request for their inmates housed out of County to receive credit for being a trustee worker in a facility other than the Boone County Jail.

Commissioner Vogt moved to authorize a budget revision as follows:
