TERM OF COMMISSION: July Session of the May Adjourned Term

PLACE OF MEETING: Boone County Government Center Commission Chambers

PRESENT WERE: Presiding Commissioner Don Stamper

Commissioner Elkin called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

Commissioner Miller introduced Ko, Seol-Hee who will be an intern with the Boone County Commission as an exchange student with the University of Missouri-Columbia's sister university in Korea. Ko, Seol-Hee is a junior studying English Literature. She will be here for three weeks. Ko, Seol-Hee stated that she was glad to be working here as an intern.

Subject: Purchasing Department

Melinda Bobbitt, Director of Purchasing Department, was present on behalf of this matter.

A. First Reading to Award Bid for Courthouse Security Upgrade

Ms. Bobbitt stated that court administration requested purchase of closed circuit TV equipment for an upgrade to the security system for the Boone County Courthouse. Purchasing recommends this equipment be purchased from the University of Missouri Coop Contract #C033-9-95 for a total of \$6,748.80, department #1230, account #91300.

Bob Perry stated that this would provide videotape capabilities of the 16 cameras in the courthouse which only have a live feed now. These will also add cameras to the front entrance to the courthouse, main entrance to the family court services, the judge's entrance and the mechanical entrance on the West Side of the courthouse. Mr. Perry stated that in the past when there were problems at the courthouse, such as vandalism, occur at the main entrance and at the family court entrance door. The placement of the mechanical entrance and the judge's entrance on the West Side of the building is difficult for patrol cars to see and with the cameras, any incident that might occur would be recorded.

Commissioner Elkin asked if the cameras would be mounted on the exterior of the building. Bob Perry stated that the cameras would be exterior.

Commissioner Miller asked if there was a budget for this. Bob Perry stated that this has been budgeted for.

Commissioner Elkin stated that the system now was closed circuit TV without recording capabilities and that this new system would allow for recording capabilities. Bob Perry stated

that this was true and that it would also provide the extra four cameras at the entrances. Mr. Perry hoped that in the future, new equipment that would be purchased would be through one central vendor.

There was no discussion from the commissioner or the public.

Commissioner Elkin requested that the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this agenda item for a second reading and an appropriate order for approval.

Subject: Presentation on Missouri Juvenile Justice Association Award to Boone County JJC by Kirk Kippley, Superintendent of Boone County JJC

Kirk Kippley introduced Kathy Wickell, the art teacher at the Boone County JJC. Mr. Kippley formally told the commission that the JJC received a meritorious achievement award from the Missouri Juvenile Justice Association in honor of their exemplary contribution for services to children, youths, and families through the Boone County Juvenile Justice Center arts program. Mr. Kippley thanked the commission for their support of the program. He believes that this program has really helped the kids and that some of their art projects would be on display at the Boone County Fair.

Subject: Purchasing Department

A. Second Reading to Award Bid for Bullet Proof Vests

Melinda Bobbitt stated that the Purchasing and Sheriff's Department recommended awarding Ed Roehr Safety Products Company for an all or nothing bid.

There was no commission or public comment on this item.

Commissioner Stamper moved to award bid number 31-27JUN01 to Ed Roehr Safety Products Company for the purchase of bullet proof vests per the attached recommendation by the Purchasing Department.

Commissioner Elkin seconded the motion.

There was no discussion from the commissioners or public comment.

The motion passed 3-0. **Order number 317-2001**

B. Second Reading and Approval of Amendment One to 15-28MAR01 (Mental Healthcare Services for Inmates).

Melinda Bobbitt stated that amendment one would allow pricing page to exhibit A to be changed to allow Dr. Daniel eight hours per week to treat inmates. Originally, this was based on averages predicting that approximately 16% of the inmate population would require mental services to

various degrees and in actuality Dr. Daniel treated 28% of the inmate population.

Commissioner Miller commented that recently the Sheriff and Dr. Daniel went to the mental health board of trustees meeting and reviewed the progress made by the department. The trustees and the Sheriff will be working on a task force to find ways to take investments made on inmates and their mental health needs to their release so it is seen that they do not re-enter the jail by keeping their appointments and trying to keep them on track.

Commissioner Miller moved that the commission approve amendment one to 15-28MAR00 Mental Healthcare Services for Inmates as outlined in the attached recommendation from the Purchasing Department. It is further ordered that the presiding commissioner be hereby authorized to sign the amendment.

Commissioner Elkin seconded the motion.

There was no discussion from the commissioners or public comment.

The motion passed 3-0. Order 318-2001

C. Second Reading and Approval of Surplus Disposal Request

Melinda Bobbitt stated that there was an attached sheet of items that have been requested to be disposed via Kemper Auction.

Commissioner Stamper moved that the commission authorizes the disposal of surplus property through Kemper Auction as listed on the July 5, 2001 memorandum from the Purchasing Department. It is further ordered that the presiding commissioner be hereby authorized to sign the disposal request.

Commissioner Elkin seconded the motion.

There was no discussion from commission or public comment.

The motion passed 3-0. Order 319-2001

D. First Reading to Award Bid for Dee Woods Road Project

Commissioner Miller stated that Public Works Department has reviewed the bids with the Purchasing Department. Commissioner Miller's goal is to see final closure this year on this project.

Commissioner Stamper stated that the record should reflect that the bid will be awarded to J.C. Industries for the Dee Woods Road project in the amount of \$404,951.51.

Commissioner Stamper stated that this item has been first read and requested that the Deputy County Clerk schedule this agenda item for a second reading and draw up an appropriate order

for approval.

There was no public comment.

E. First Reading to Award Bid for Prisoner Transport Van Conversion

Melinda Bobbitt stated bid number 34-27JUN01 that on June 1, 2001 the Purchasing Department received a request from the Sheriff Department to issue a Bid for the Furnishing and Delivery of a Prisoner Transport Van Conversion. The bid was issued on June 12.

The Bid closed on June 27, 2001. One bid was received from Bob Barker Company, Inc.

Purchasing and the Sheriff's Department recommend award to the Bob Barker Company of North Carolina for one Prisoner Transport Van Conversion and one Interior Video Package.

The cost of the total contract to Bob Barker Company is \$6,495.00, and will be paid out of organization 1255, account 92300. \$6,800 was originally budgeted for this purchase.

There was no public comment.

Commissioner Stamper stated that this item has been first read and requested that the Deputy County Clerk schedule this agenda item for a second reading with an appropriate order for approval.

F. First Reading to Award Bid for Office Furniture Term and Supply

Melinda Bobbitt stated that bid number 22-27JUN01, the bid for Office Furniture Term and Supply was issued on June 11, 2001. The Bid closed on June 27. A total of four bids were received from the following vendors: Marathon Office Interiors, Nolan Office Interiors, Corporate Express, Inc., and Inside the Lines.

The Evaluation Committee for this bid met on July 9. The following individuals served on the Evaluation Committee: Jacki Davidson, Chief Clerk, Assessor's Office, Betty Dickneite, Director, Human Resources, and Leasa Quick, Budget Administrator, Sheriff Department.

Please find attached the Committee's recommendation, along with the Bid Tabulation. The Evaluation Committee is recommending award to Inside the Lines for offering the best bid for Boone County. Inside the Lines offered the lowest discount price on most of the line items in the bid and also on installation, reconfiguration and design services. They are a local vendor in Columbia, Missouri. Following the analysis of the Furniture items budgeted for the year 2001, it was determined that the over all cost for Inside the Lines will be \$44,878.52 versus Corporate Express cost of \$47,886.56. The Committee recommends that Inside the Lines be granted the Award for the anticipated savings of \$3,008.04 for this 2001 year.

This contract shall run through December 31, 2001 with four, one-year renewals. As this is a

Term and Supply contract, there are no attached Purchasing Requisitions.

There was no comment from the commissioners or the public.

Commissioner Stamper stated that this item has been first read and requested that the Deputy County Clerk schedule this agenda item for a second reading with an appropriate order for approval.

H. First Reading for Approval of Sheriff Vehicle Disposal

Melinda Bobbitt stated that the following list of Sheriff's vehicles that have recently been replaced. Purchasing is requesting Commission approval to dispose of these vehicles through the Kirksville Auto Auction with Cornell Motors serving as our representative.

Commissioner Stamper stated that the Dodge Intrepid was previously used for highway transportation of people between correctional facilities and has around 90,000 highway miles on it.

Commissioner Stamper moved to approve the contract agreement between Boone County and Structural Preservation Systems Inc., for the strengthening of Boone County Bridges. It is further ordered that the presiding commissioner be hereby approved to sign the contract agreement.

Commissioner Miller seconded the motion.

There was no public comment.

The motion passed 3-0. Order 320-2001

C. First Reading to Approve Budget Amendment for Landscaping related to parking lot and architect reimbursables

This is regarding the Reality House landscaping work for \$745 and the auditor's office added the architect reimbursables to this amendment in the amount of \$9.00.

Commissioner Miller stated that this would finalize all the projects with the Reality House.

There was no public comment.

Commissioner Stamper stated that this item has been first read and requested that the Deputy County Clerk schedule this agenda item for a second reading with an appropriate order for approval.

Subject: Recorder of Deeds Office – Approval of Copier Lease Agreement

Bettie Johnson, Boone County Recorder of Deeds, was present on behalf of this item.

Bettie Johnson stated that the copiers in the Recorders office have been leased since 1991 and every few years the equipment has been upgraded, in 1991, 1993, 1997, and in late 2000. After the upgrade in late 2000, the auditor's office discovered that the current lease did not contain a non-appropriation clause. Mrs. Johnson also stated that because of company policy, they would not add that statement to the current lease. She is asking for the commission to approve the remaining lease forward with a non-appropriation clause included.

Bettie Johnson stated that this matter has gone through several discussions with the intent of looking at possible alternatives. John Patton, Commissioner Elkin, Bettie Johnson, and ICON have all had discussions to move this item forward.

Commissioner Stamper asked if this action comes forward from the recommendations of these discussions. Bettie Johnson replied yes.

Commissioner Stamper noted that this was a non-budget item and would have no effect on the budget.

Commissioner Miller asked if this was a continuation of the current lease. Commissioner Stamper replied yes. Bettie Johnson stated that this addition of the non-appropriation clause was being added to the current lease.

Commissioner Stamper moved to waive the first reading of this item and move forward with the second reading. Commissioner Stamper moved that the presiding commissioner be authorized to sign the lease agreement for copying equipment for the Boone County Recorder of Deeds Office for 53 months from IOS Capital Inc.

Commissioner Stamper stated that yes and this was the best resolution possible for this item.
