The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

Subject: Purchasing Department

Heather Turner, Purchasing Department Buyer, was present on behalf of these items.

A. Second Reading and Approval of Amendment #2 to Bid 66-12NOV02 (Law Enforcement Uniforms and Equipment and Red The Uniform Tailor contract)

Commissioner Elkin moved to approve Amendment #2 to Bid 66-12NOV02 for Law Enforcement Uniforms Term and Supply with Leon Uniforms Company, Inc. and approve an additional contract for said bid with Red The Uniform Tailor, Inc.

Commissioner Miller seconded the motion.

There was no discussion and no public comment.

The motion passed 3-0. Order 41-2005

B. Second Reading and Approval of Additional Recommendation for Award to Bid 78-23NOV04 (Shop Fluids Term and Supply)

Commissioner Miller moved to approve an additional contract with McCollister and Company for bid 78-23NOV04 for Shop Fluids Term and Supply.

Commissioner Elkin seconded the motion.

There was no discussion and no public comment.

The motion passed 3-0. Order 42-2005

C. First Reading of Bid 77-23DEC04 (Router Maintenance Term & Supply)

Heather Turner stated the Bid for Router Maintenance for the Information Technology Department closed on December 23, 2004. One bid was received. A vendor who submitted a "no bid" on this bid indicated they were unable to provide router maintenance for the County because they are not a BayNetworks reseller. Therefore, Purchasing and Information Technology recommend award to the only bidder, Integrated Solutions Group.

This Term & Supply contract will be paid out of department 1170 Information Technology, Account Number 60050 Equipment Service Contract. The budgeted amount for FY 2005 for router maintenance is \$2,200.00.

Commissioner Elkin asked if this is a new contract. Michael Mallicoat, Information Technology Director, stated this is a renewal of the contract.

Commissioner Miller asked why the vendor has to sell BayNetworks. Mr. Mallicoat stated this is the equipment the department uses.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for award.

D. First Reading of Maximus Inc. Agreement

Heather Turner stated this is the agreement with Maximus Inc. of Springfield, Illinois for the Cost Allocation Plan for the Auditor's office. The plan will be based on actual costs for the year ended December 31, 2004.

The Auditor's office requests to extend the contract for one more year and to continue to purchase this service from Maximus Inc.

Total cost of contract is \$6,990 from department 1190 – non-departmental, account 71101 – professional services. There is a remaining balance of \$101,600 in the account.

Commissioner Miller stated this is an annual contract so the County can be reimbursed for State grants.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

E. First Reading of Bid 02-04JAN05 (Solid Block Asphalt Sealant Term & Supply)

The Bid for Solid Block Asphalt Sealant for the Public Works Department closed on January 4, 2005. Three bids were received. Purchasing and Public Works recommend award to the low bidder, Paving Maintenance Supply, Inc.

This Term & Supply contract will be paid out of department 2040 Public Works Maintenance Operations, Account Number 26000 Pavement Repairs Material. There is a total of \$120,000.00 in the Pavement Repairs Material budget for FY 05.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for award.

F. First Reading of Bid 01-04JAN05 (125 Gallon Asphalt Sealant Melter Applicator)

The Bid for a 125 Gallon Asphalt Sealant Melter Applicator closed on January 4, 2005. Five bids were received. Purchasing and the Public Work's department recommend award to Vance Brothers, Inc. for submitting the low bid. As noted in the attached memo from Public Works, three different brands of Applicators were bid. Public Works inspected the 2 lowest priced machines for adherence to the specifications, and determined the low bid met the specifications.

Total cost of the contract is \$33,741.00 to be paid out of department 2040 - PW Maintenance Operations, account number 92300 – Replacement Machinery and Equipment. The budgeted amount for this purchase is \$35,000.00.

The Public Works Department has written a memo on the award recommendation.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for award.

Subject: Information Technology – First Reading of Contract with Integrated Solutions Group

Michael Mallicoat, Information Technology Director, was present on behalf of this item.

Michael Mallicoat stated this is a contract with Integrated Solutions Group for network security upgrades. The target completion date for this is the end of February 2005.

Commission Miller stated the County contracts out the security work. Mr. Mallicoat stated that is correct and it has always been done this way.

Commissioner Miller asked why the County is unable to do this work. Mr. Mallicoat stated at this time the department does not have the training. However, they will be able to perform this work in the future.

Commissioner Elkin asked if this is done on an annual basis. Mr. Mallicoat stated it should be done on an annual basis but has not been done for two years.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

Commissioner Miller stated this will be less expensive as compared to the past when the County was paying \$30,000 per year for one employee. This will actually provide two employees.

Mr. Abell noted the person that used to work for the University on this project is now working for the City.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

Thad Yonke, County Planner, was present on behalf of this item.

Thad Yonke stated this is a two lot minor plat located near Harrisburg.
