The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

#### **Subject: Tax Rate Hearing**

Commissioner Schnarre opened the floor for a public hearing on the proposed tax rates.

Wendy S. Noren, Boone County Clerk, was present on behalf of this item.

Wendy Noren stated this is a hearing for county tax levies; general revenue, common road and bridge, group homes and county-wide surtax on subclass III property.

Each reassessment year, the group homes levy is reduced. This is a voted levy and there is no option for the Commission to change that.

She, Commissioner Schnarre and County Auditor June Pitchford had a meeting a few weeks ago regarding the tax rates. Commissioner Schnarre recommended advertising the road and bridge levy at \$0.05. The general revenue levy is down by \$0.01 from the 2004 rate.

Ms. Noren stated she and Mrs. Pitchford believe that the road and bridge levy should also be reduced. Mrs. Pitchford sent a memo to the Commission with this suggestion.

Ms. Noren noted the balance of the order is levies that have been turned in by other jurisdictions and are not really part of this hearing. There are several jurisdictions that the paper work has not been received from the State Auditor's office. She cannot say if these are final numbers or not. If there are any changes, this order will be amended by the Commission.

Commissioner Miller stated she believes the road and bridge levy should remain at \$0.05 because when the public voted on this they said it would be at \$0.05.

Ms. Noren stated the reason for reducing the levy is because during a reassessment year, the State legislature almost made a law requiring jurisdictions to reduce levies during a reassessment year. A compromise was reached and this proposed language did not

become law but the State will be looking at jurisdictions that do not reduce levies during reassessment years.

There is nothing illegal about not changing a levy but she recommends this levy be changed.

There was discussion about tax ceilings, levies, and formulas.

The Commission agreed to reduce the common road and bridge to \$0.0475. This will change the County of Boone levy to \$0.2789.

Commissioner Elkin moved to set the 2005 tax rates per hundred dollars of assessed valuation for county purposes as follows:
