## **Health Department**

1. 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> reading; Abatement of a property located at 900 W. Colchester Road, parcel # 11-303-11-05-017.00 01

Kris Vellema said that the pictures in the packet speak for themselves. The owner called last week saying the property is going through foreclosure. There is nothing yet in the Recorders Office to show that. The abatement process was explained to the owner. There have been many complaints by the neighbors. It has not been mowed this year. The bid is \$245. It is a big lot, approximately 1.4 acres.

# 4. Public Hearing on adoption of a new County Food Code

Commissioner Atwill said this is the second of three public hearings on the adoption of the new County Food Code.

Kala Wekenborg said she has no additional information to add since the last Public Hearing.

Commissioner Atwill opened the Public Hearing and asked if there is anyone present that

would like to speak on this issue.

Rick Colley, owner of C & S Grocery in Harrisburg wanted to know why the permit fees have increased from \$150 in 2010 to \$250 this year for his small store.

Commissioner Atwill said that with the new rate increase, the County will be paying 1/3 of the cost of the actual inspections. The County would like to be in a position where they have a little more equity in the cost of what is done to inspect food service properties and food handlers.

Ms. Wekenborg said this was discussed during the County budget cycle on an annual basis and it is up to the Commission to ultimately decide on what the fees will be. The goal, overall, is to get to 50% of the recovered cost. Currently it is at 30% and there have been small increases over time. There has not been one large increase in one given year. The County Food Code is completely separate from the fees. This hearing is more on the adoption of the code, not on the fees. When the new code is implemented, it does not affect the fee schedule.

Commissioner Atwill said that the fee issue does not apply at this hearing.

Mr. Colley said it is very hard for a little grocery store to compete these days and the \$250 comes right out of the bottom line. Store owners are working for \$6/hr.

Commissioner Atwill said he understands the concerns of the small owner and wishes that it were different. The need for these inspections is great. We can't single out and say we will only inspect certain people. This is an issue when we have large and small communities scattered over a large area. The fee issue was discussed earlier, so it won't be something we can consider today. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> of three hearings and if there is an issue pertaining to the Food Code, we will listen to those.

Mr. Colley said he has no issues with the Food Code.

Ms. Wekenborg said the fees are on a tiered scale, based off grocery sales and the type of food that is prepared in the establishments. The rates for a smaller store, like the one owned by Mr. Colley, are not assessed the same as a full service food establishment.

Mr. Colley thanked the Commission for listening to his concerna-

Commissioner Atwill asked if there is anyone else present that would like to speak on the adoption of the new Food Code. There were no additional speakers and Commissioner Atwill closed the Public Hearing.
