- 3. **Delivery** Contractor agrees to deliver the motor graders per the bid specifications and within sixty (60) days after receipt of order.

In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, the terms, conditions, provisions and requirements contained in the bid specifications including Instructions and General Conditions of Bidding, Primary Specifications, Response Presentation and Review, and the unexecuted Response Form shall prevail and control over the Contractor's bid response.
- 2. **Purchase** The County agrees to purchase from the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to supply the County a quantity of one (1) 2002 Ford F550 4x4 Truck including all alternates with the exception of alternate 11; optional equipment of a Auto Crane 2003 series and a Miller Bobcat 225NT welding machine; less the trade in of a 1993 F350 with a 9' Utility body for the total price of \$62,996.70.

Also the Contractor agrees to supply the County a quantity of one (1) 2002 Ford F450 4x4 Truck including all alternates; optional equipment of a Miller Bobcat 225NT welding machine; less the trade in of a 1988 F250 with a 9' Utility body for the total price of \$43,639.70.

The final price of the contract to Contractor is \$106,636.40. All new Utility Service Trucks and Equipment will be provided in conformity with the bid specifications and as set forth in the Contractor's bid response. All trade in Truck and Equipment will be accepted as is, where is for the values proposed in the bid response.

- 3. **Delivery** Contractor agrees to deliver the Service Utility Trucks and Equipment per the bid specifications and within ninety (90) days after receipt of order.
- 4. *Billing and Payment* All billing shall be invoiced to the Boone County Public Works Department and billings may only include the prices listed in the Contractor's bid response. No additional fees for delivery or extra services or taxes shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in the Contractor's bid response to the specifications. The County agrees to pay all invoices within thirty days of receipt; Contractor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts offered in its bid response if county makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a

billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount; in the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Contractor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.

- 5. **Binding Effect** This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this agreement remains in full force and effect.
- 6. *Entire Agreement* This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual agreement. This agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this agreement.
- 7. **Termination** This agreement may be terminated by the County upon thirty days advance written notice for any of the following reasons or under any of the following circumstances:
 - County may terminate this agreement due to material breach of any term or condition of this agreement, or
 - b. County may terminate this agreement if in the opinion of the Boone County Commission if delivery of products are delayed or products delivered are not in conformity with bidding specifications or variances authorized by County, or
 - c. If appropriations are not made available and budgeted for any calendar year.

The public now has the ability to query the assessor's file through the Internet. The demand for this information has exceeded our expectations. This implementation has reduced staff time spent answering and disseminating this information over the telephone.

The implementation of a geographic information system (GIS) has been under way for the past four years. The City of Columbia, Boone Electric Cooperative and the County of Boone entered into a cooperative five-year GIS plan. This project is on schedule and under budget. When this program is fully implemented, the benefits of the system will far exceed the costs incurred. These benefits include: less redundancy of work by various county offices, better public service and better information for decision making.

Boone County has completed the combination of all contiguous parcels under common ownership.
