PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR JANITORIAL PAPER PRODUCTS TERM AND SUPPLY

IN CONSIDERATION of the parties performance of the respective obligations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. Contract Documents - This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement For Janitorial Paper Products Term and Supply, County of Boene Request for Bid, bid number 09-06FEB02, Introduction and General Terms and Conditions of Bidding, Primary Specifications, Response Presentation and Review, the un-executed Response Form, Standard Terms and Conditions, as well as the Contractor's bid response dated February 4, 2002 and executed by Dan Vogt on behalf of the Contractor. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with bid response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office bid file for this bid if not attached. In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, the Introduction and General Terms and Conditions of Bidding, Primary Specifications, Response Presentation and Review, the un-executed Response Form, and the Standard Terms and Conditions shall prevail and control over the Contractor's bid response.

2. Contract Duration - This agreement shall commence on the date written above through December 31, 2002, subject to the provisions for termination specified below. This agreement may be extended beyond the expiration date by order of the County for four (4) additional one year periods subject to the pricing clauses in the Contractor's bid response and thereafter on a month to month basis in the event the County is unable to re-bid and/or award a new contract prior to the expiration date after exercising diligent efforts to do so or not; provided, however, that from and after the expiration date of this agreement and any annual extensions thereof, Contractor shall have the right to terminate this agreement upon thirty days advance written notice of termination.

3. *Purchase* - The County agrees to purchase from the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to supply the County Janitorial Paper Products as identified and responded to in the Contractor's Response Form. Items will be provided as required in the bid specifications and in conformity with the contract documents for the prices set forth in the Contractor's bid response, as needed and as ordered by the County.

4. *Delivery* - Contractor agrees to deliver the items as specified within one to two days after receipt of order.

5. Billing and Payment - All billing shall be invoiced to the Department placing the order, and may only include the prices as identified in the Contractor's bid response. No additional fees for delivery or extra services not included in the bid response or taxes shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in the Contractor's bid response to the specifications. The County agrees to pay all invoices within thirty days of receipt; Contractor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts offered in its bid response if county makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount; in the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Contractor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.

6. Binding Effect - This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this agreement remains in full force and effect.

7. Entire Agreement - This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual agreement. This agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this agreement.

8. *Termination* - This agreement may be terminated by the County upon thirty days advance written notice for any of the following reasons or under any of the following circumstances:

- a. County may terminate this agreement due to material breach of any term or condition of this agreement, or
- b. County may terminate this agreement if in the opinion of the Boone County Commission if delivery of products are delayed or products delivered are not in conformity with bidding specifications or variances authorized by County, or
- c. If appropriations are not made available and budgeted for any calendar year.

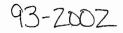

PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR SERVICE UTILITY TRUCKS

1. **Contract Documents** - This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement for a Service Utility Trucks, County of Boone Request for Bid for Service Utility Trucks, bid number 72-26DEC01 including Instructions and General Conditions of Bidding, Primary Specifications, Response Presentation and Review, and the unexecuted Response Form, as well as the Contractor's bid response dated December 26, 2001, executed by Ralph Harn, on behalf of the Contractor. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with bid response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office bid file for this bid if not attached. In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, the terms, conditions, provisions and requirements contained in the bid specifications including Instructions and General Conditions of Bidding, Primary Specifications, Response Presentation and Review, and the unexecuted Response Form shall prevail and control over the Contractor's bid response.

2. **Purchase** - The County agrees to purchase from the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to supply the County a quantity of one (1) 2002 Ford F550 4x4 Truck including all alternates; optional equipment of a Auto Crane 2003 series and a Miller Bobcat 225NT welding machine; less the trade in of a 1993 F350 with a 9' Utility body for the total price of \$66,769.00.

Also the Contractor agrees to supply the County a quantity of one (1) 2002 Ford F550 4x4 Truck including all alternates; optional equipment of a Miller Bobcat 225NT welding machine; less the trade in of a 1988 F250 with a 9' Utility body for the total price of \$42,712.00.

The final price of the contract to Contractor is \$109,481.00. All new Utility Service Trucks and Equipment will be provided in conformity with the bid specifications and as set forth in the Contractor's bid response. All trade in Truck and Equipment will be accepted as is, where is for the values proposed in the bid response.

3. **Delivery** - Contractor agrees to deliver the Service Utility Trucks and Equipment per the bid specifications and within one hundred (100) days after receipt of order.

In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount; in the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Contractor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.

5. Binding Effect - This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this agreement remains in full force and effect.

6. Entire Agreement - This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual agreement. This agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this agreement.

7. Termination - This agreement may be terminated by the County upon thirty days advance written notice for any of the following reasons or under any of the following circumstances:

- a. County may terminate this agreement due to material breach of any term or condition of this agreement, or
- b. County may terminate this agreement if in the opinion of the Boone County Commission if delivery of products are delayed or products delivered are not in conformity with bidding specifications or variances authorized by County, or
- c. If appropriations are not made available and budgeted for any calendar year.

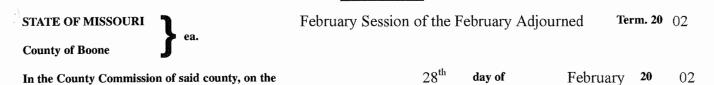

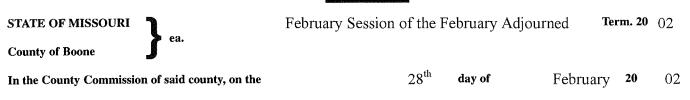

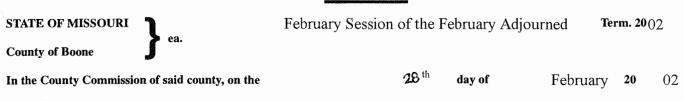
