Employee Classifications

We have reviewed the letter from the Assessor's office and the information from Tracy Redmon and Loutisha Glasgow. Based on this information, we recommend that the two employees be classified as Personal Property Clerks (job class 1098). We recommend that this change be effective on the June 6, 2002 date of the request.

We have also reviewed information provided by the Recorder's office and confirm that Carol Green should be classified as a Deputy Recorder (job class 2013).

We have also reviewed the other positions currently classified as Office Specialist (job class 1022). These classifications are consistent with the design of the Office Specialist and do not appear to require further revisions.

Future Reclassifications

The classification plan provides for several entry level positions. These are positions that require a minimum of general experience and no specialized training. The Office Specialist job class is the entry level for office/clerical positions.

The Office Specialist job is a position in several departments. It provides the opportunity for the department to hire an employee that does not have experience in a particular field, and to train that employee. Once the employee has been fully trained and has the required skills, that employee should be promoted within the department's office job family. Typically, it will require at least two years for an employee to gain the skills and demonstrate the level of performance necessary for promotion. The promotion decision should follow the County's regular policies regarding promotion.

Skill Based Pay

The skilled based pay program was designed several years ago for the Public Works Department and was revised in 2001. Skill based pay is not used in any other area of the County.

The intent of the program was to focus on skill development rather than performance. We understand that the department's goal was to encourage employee development and to assure that employees had the appropriate skills for their current jobs and for future promotions.

In its original concept, there was to be no additional cost to the program. The program was to be funded with the regular salary increase budget established by the County. The same increase budget would be provided to all departments; Public Works would allocate the budget based on skill attainment while other departments would allocate the budget based on performance.

In practice, there has been additional cost for the skill based program. The program did not limit the number or type of skills for which an employee could train and test. As a result, employees chose skills that they were interested in, and acquired more skills than were anticipated.

The program was revised in 2001 to correct this problem. Skills were grouped into modules. Each module represents a set of skills that relate to particular job tasks, such as maintenance, equipment operations, etc. Under this revised program, employees can develop only those skills in a module that relates to a job they are doing or would be likely to do. They must complete all of the skills in one module before they can work on skills in a different module. And there is a limit on the number of skills any one employee can attain in any one fiscal year. These controls avoid a situation where an employee acquires and the County pays for these skills, but the employee never uses these skills.


PSPC has recommended that the County continue the skill based pay program, as modified, for several reasons.

- The program promotes employee development, which is one of the objectives established in the focus group meetings. In addition, the focus group participants were positive about the program.
- The concept of skill based pay is appropriate for jobs in the Public Works area, where work is typically performed by work crews in a team setting. In addition, the emphasis on skill development is important to maintaining a safe work environment and managing liability.
- The program appears to be understood by employees, and appears to motivate skill development.
- With budgetary controls, the program does not provide additional salary opportunity for Public Works employees. In simply represents a different way of allocating the same budget. Maintaining these controls is particularly important, so that the differences in this program do not appear to be inequitable to employees in other areas.

The purpose of this letter is to respond to the series of classification and re-classification issues that you have forwarded to us. In addition, this letter provides some suggested guidelines for addressing job family promotions and skill based pay.

Job Classifications

We have reviewed documentation for four additional positions requested for next year's budget. We have analyzed the documentation for these new positions, and compared their duties and requirements to other jobs in the Salary Plan. Based on this review, we recommend the following placement for three of these jobs.

The fourth request is from the Collector's office for a position in the programmer analyst job series. Therefore, this request does not require development of a new job classification. The position description questionnaire (PDQ) does provide sufficient information to define the specific job classification; however, it does not provide sufficient information to determine whether the job is a Programmer Analyst or a Senior Programmer Analyst.

The difference between the two job levels is experience and expertise. The best approach may be to recruit for the position and determine the level of the job based on the available candidates. (There is a 10% difference between midpoints for the two job levels.)


