#### **Subject: Purchasing Department**

Heather Turner, Purchasing Department Buyer, was present on behalf of these items.

### A. Open Bid 74-12OCT04 (Summers Lane Neighborhood Improvement District)

Commissioner Miller asked what the budget was for this project. Heather Turner stated the project manager's estimate was \$62,000.00.

### C. First Reading of Bid 68-28SEP04 (Cuppy Lane and Lost Woods Lane Projects)

Heather Turner stated The Bid for Cuppy Lane and Lost Woods Lane Projects closed on September 30, 2004. Four bids were received. Purchasing and the Public Work's

department recommend award to Bill Sullivan Excavation, Inc. for submitting the low bid.

Total cost of contract is \$39,320.00 with a 10% contingency of \$3,932.00 for a total Purchase Order amount of \$43,252.00. This contract will be paid out of department 2040 - PW Maintenance Operations, account number 71100 – Outside Services. There is a total of \$105,190.00 remaining in the Class 7 budget at the time of this reading.

Commissioner Miller asked what the estimate was for this project. Heather Turner stated she does not believe there was an estimate for this project because money was pulled from several different accounts.

Commissioner Miller stated there was no budget for this project. Heather Turner stated that is correct.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this going to be an in-house project.

# B. Authorize Presiding Commissioner to sign Grant Awards with Missouri Department of Transportation Highway Safety Division

Captain Dwayne Carey was present on behalf of this item.

Captain Carey stated these are federal grants the department has received for a number of years. The DWI Enforcement Grant is for DWI saturation and check points in the spring, summer and fall. The Hazardous Moving Violations Grant is used to assign officers to enforce hazardous moving violations where they are not subject to calls. This is a way for deputies to make some extra money and enforce the traffic laws.

Captain Carey noted Operation Slow Down has been very successful.

Commissioner Elkin moved to authorize the Presiding Commissioner to sign the following Grant Awards with the Missouri Department of Transportation Highway Safety Division:

- Hazardous Moving Violations Grant in the amount of \$10,068.48
- DWI Enforcement Grant in the amount of \$7,708.68

## **Subject: Planning and Zoning – First Reading of Revision to Zoning Regulations** (Sign Regulations)

Stan Shawver, Planning and Zoning Director, was present on behalf of this item.

Stan Shawver stated the Commission has held many worksessions to discuss the Sign Regulations. During the worksessions, suggestions and revisions were made to the Sign ordinance. The Commission has reviewed the Sign ordinance and has given indications they are ready to move forward with this.

The Sign Regulations will be Section 25 of the Zoning Regulations. Also, there is an amendment to Section 15.C(4)(f) of the Board of Adjustment Powers of the Board.

The Sign Regulations encompass all types of signs such as on-premise signs or business signs. The size of the sign and height of the sign are in the Regulations. The other issue is the placement of billboards, which has been narrowed down to along I-70 and Highway 63. Size and placement of billboards is noted in the Regulations. Signs can only be on commercially or industrially zoned land. Placement of signs or billboards have to be

indicated on a planned development.

There were no regulations specifically but signs and billboards were regulated through State requirements.

Mr. Shawver noted there was discussion about a possible amortization schedule to do away with existing signs over a period of time. The Commission chose not to require that at this time.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a new section of the Zoning Regulations. The Commission approved new regulations earlier in the year.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the November 3, 2004 meeting with an appropriate order approval.

## Subject: Authorize Presiding Commissioner to sign the Land-Use Planning and Water Quality Restoration in Bonne Femme Creek Watershed Project Grant

Bill Florea, County Planner, was present on behalf of this item.

Bill Florea stated this is the second phase of the Bonne Femme Creek Watershed Project. This is a federally funded grant through the 319 Clean Water Act Program. The grant requires a 40% local match, which is being met by a combination of project partners in kind services. There will be some local cash match generated through the cost share programs. Boone County is contributing some in kind match as well.

The second phase of this project is the next 15 months. During the next 15 months, the following milestones will need to be completed:

- Conduct two watershed forums. One forum has already been conducted and Commissioner Miller attended
- Workshop for the development community. This will be the Conservation Development Workshop
- Public Meeting/Open House. This will be the annual meeting.
- Complete the Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis. The contractor has been hired and the kick off meeting was last week. The contractor is beginning the data acquisition phase of the project.
- Development of Watershed Management Plan. This is being done with the assistance of the Stakeholders group and the oversight of the Policy Committee.

Commissioner Miller stated she attended the meeting last night. They are getting started. They wanted to know how the Policy Committee worked with the Stakeholder Committee. The Stakeholder Committee reviews the data and information, they represent the landowners, development and environmental communities. They bring forward recommendations to the City of Ashland, City of Columbia, Water Districts and Boone County and request policies be changed to improve water quality. She believes they have a great group and they have good suggestions which she will be bringing to the Commission for discussion. They are concerned with some absenteeism of some members.

Commissioner Schnarre asked if this is the final phase of this project. Mr. Florea stated this is a four year project and this is the second phase. There will be approximately 18 month left in the project.

Commissioner Miller moved to authorize the Presiding Commissioner to sign the Land-Use Planning and Water Quality Restoration in Bonne Femme Creek Watershed Project Grant from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.

Commissioner Elkin seconded the motion.

Two or three properties have been eliminated because of the two mile boundary.

### Boone Electric C.A.S.H./H.E.L.P. Program
