The parties shall not use or disclose any information about a recipient of the services provided under this Agreement for any purpose not connected with the parties' contract responsibilities, except with the written consent of such recipient, recipient's attorney, or recipient's parent or guardian.

Chapter 488 **Court Costs** Section 488.5375

August 28, 2013

Additional cost, certain felony sexual offenses with electronic devices seized.

488.5375. Upon a plea of guilty or a finding of guilt for a felony sexual offense in which computers, computer equipm or other electronic devices were seized, the court may, in addition to imposition of any penalties provided by law, ord local law enforcement agency for the costs incurred by such agency in the examination of any computer, computer eq telephones, or other electronic devices seized. Such costs shall include the reasonable costs of performing examination enforcement agency may establish a schedule of such costs; except that, the court may order the costs reduced if the excessive.

Page 49 of the 2014 SCCG Solicitation:

Program Income - - used to identify any monies earned and/or expended as a result of the grantfunded project. Program income is revenue/income generated as a direct result of an agencyfunded project. Program income must be used for the purposes of and under the conditions applicable to the award. Unless specified otherwise, program income shall be expended within the contract period.

Program income from asset seizures and forfeitures is considered earned when the property has been adjudicated to the benefit of the plaintiff (i.e., law enforcement entity). Federal equitable sharing monies earned as a result of grant activities may be expended over the life of the project so long as it is continually reported. If the cost is allowable under the SCCG grant program, the cost would be allowable using program income.

I'm not seeing anything in 488.5375 RSMo saying how it may be spent or where it should be deposited. This method of collection is not considered asset forfeitures or seizures but could arguably be similar since it is subject to court approval and may not be timely reimbursements. It is not as straight forward as charging and collecting a fee right on the spot, which is where the idea of program income first originated. It's evolving with new laws and scenarios.

It would be considered program income because it was money generated as a result of a grant-funded project. You will report it is as Earned on your next Claim report, assuming it was received in May. If received prior to May, we may need to edit the appropriate Claim reports to get it reflected against the correct time period.

In regards to where the money is deposited, that will be dependent on your county accounts and discretion. It will be money separate from the grant obviously and just needs to be tracked accordingly. When and if it is

spent (either in whole or in part), you'll report it as Expended against the appropriate month's Claim report. We keep a spreadsheet of activity for Program Income.
