





The Bid for Peabody Road Asphalt Overlay, 2010 Pavement Preservation closed on April 22, 2010. Three bids were received. Purchasing and the Public Works department recommend award to APAC Missouri for offering the lowest and best bid for Boone County.

The Bid Amount for this project was \$143,331.75. The R.A.P. (Recycled Asphalt Product) deduction from the Bid Amount is equal to \$2.00 per ton multiplied by 1575 estimated tons, for a total deduction of \$3,150.00. The R.A.P. deduction brings the Bid Amount to \$140,181.75. After including a 10% contingency amount of \$14,018.18 this project has a Purchase Order total of \$154,199.93. Invoices from this contract will be paid from department 2041 – PW – Pavement Preservation, account 71100 – Outside Services. The engineer's estimated amount was \$157,630.00.

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the County of Boone through the Boone County Commission (hereinafter referred to as the Owner), and **APAC Missouri**, (hereinafter referred to as the Contractor).

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the acceptance of Contractor's bid and the award of this contract to said Contractor by the Owner and in further consideration of the agreements of the parties herein contained, to be well and truly observed and faithfully kept by them, and each of them, it is agreed between the parties as follows, to wit:

It is understood and agreed that, except as may be otherwise provided for by the "General Specifications, and "Technical Specifications," and "Special Provisions" the work shall be done in accordance with the "Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 1999", a copy of which can be obtained from the State of Missouri, Missouri Highway and Transportation Division in Jefferson City, Missouri. Said Specifications are part and parcel of this contract, and are incorporated in this contract as fully and effectively as if set forth in detail herein.

The Contractor further agrees that he is fully informed regarding all of the conditions affecting the work to be done, and labor and materials to be furnished for the completion of this contract, and that his information was secured by personal investigation and research and not from any estimates of the Owner; and that he will make no claim against the Owner by reason of estimates, tests, or representation of any officer, agent, or employees of the Owner.

The said Contractor agrees further to begin work not later than the authorized date in the Notice to Proceed, and to complete the work within the time specified in the contract documents or such additional time as may be allowed by the Engineer under the contract.

The work shall be done to complete satisfaction of the Owner and, in the case the Federal Government or any agency thereof is participating in the payment of the cost of construction of the work, the work shall also be subject to inspection and approval at all times by the proper agent or officials of such government agency.

The parties hereto agree that this contract in all things shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri.

Contractor agrees it will pay not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages to all workers performing work under the contract in accordance with the prevailing wage determination issued by the Division of Labor Standards of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations for the State of Missouri and as maintained on file with the Boone County Public Works Department.

The Contractor further agrees that it shall forfeit as a penalty to the County of Boone the sum of \$100.00 for each worker employed for each calendar day or portion thereof such worker is paid less than the stipulated rates set forth in the prevailing wage determination for the project for any work done under this contract by the Contractor or by any Subcontractor employed by the Contractor pursuant to the provisions of Section 290.250 RSMo. The Contractor further agrees that it will abide by all provisions of the prevailing wage law as set forth in Chapter 290 RSMo. and rules and regulations issued thereunder and that any penalties assessed may be withheld from sums due to the Contractor by the Owner.

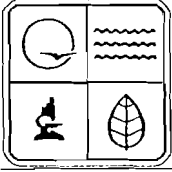

The proposed project is for maintenance of the existing MKT Nature and Fitness Trail due to weather related damage. If awarded RTP funding, the Boone County Public Works Department staff will do a one-phase bank stabilization project to reduce flood damage on the 4.2 mile County-owned section of the MKT Trail. County maintenance workers will construct soil drains in 50- foot increments along the Hinkson Creek bank. The goal is to drain the dirt from the creek bank and take pressure off of the weaker soil. This will stop the trail from dropping into the creek during periods of heavy rain.

The County’s portion of the MKT Trail, which is located next to the Hinkson Creek, is damaged at least once each year because of flooding. Since 2007, the County has spent an average of \$30,000 a year on repairs to its section of the trail. These temporary repair measures have served as a bandage rather than a permanent solution to the problem. The proposed bank stabilization project would eliminate the need for costly annual repairs and bring some much-needed economic relief to the citizens of Boone County. In addition, the health of this section of the trail is essential for residents and visitors to safely enjoy the MKT trail and to gain access to the Katy Trail.

The MKT Trail is one of the top trails in Boone County. It is jointly owned by the City of Columbia and the County of Boone. In 2000, it was designated as a Community Millennium Trail by the White House Millennium Council. It is used year-round for bicycling, hiking, jogging, walking and cross country skiing. The trail has both local and regional significance as the County’s portion of the trail connects to the state’s Katy Trail.


I have been asked to provide this letter of assurance as part of the County's application for funding from MoDNR's Recreational Trails Grant Program.

This letter is to express the strong support of the City of Columbia's Department of Parks and Recreation for Boone County's 2010 grant application to the Recreational Trails Grant Program for funding to address a serious erosion problem occurring along the County's portion of the joint City/County MKT Trail.

The 8.2 mile MKT Trail links downtown Columbia to the 200 mile statewide Katy Trail. The City of Columbia manages and maintains the 4.7 mile portion of the trail that extends from Fourth and Cherry Streets in downtown Columbia to Scott Boulevard at the far southwest edge of the City. Boone County maintains and operates the 3.2 mile portion of the trail leading from Scott Boulevard to the Katy Trail. The jointly managed trail provides a critical link to the statewide trail for both the citizens of Columbia and those of rural Boone County.

A section of the County's portion of the trail is now threatened by a serious erosion problem occurring from flooding of the nearby Hinkson Creek. Should this situation not be corrected it is possible that City's link to the statewide system will be lost. Funding of this grant application will allow the erosion problem to be corrected prior to serious damage occurring to that portion of the trail.

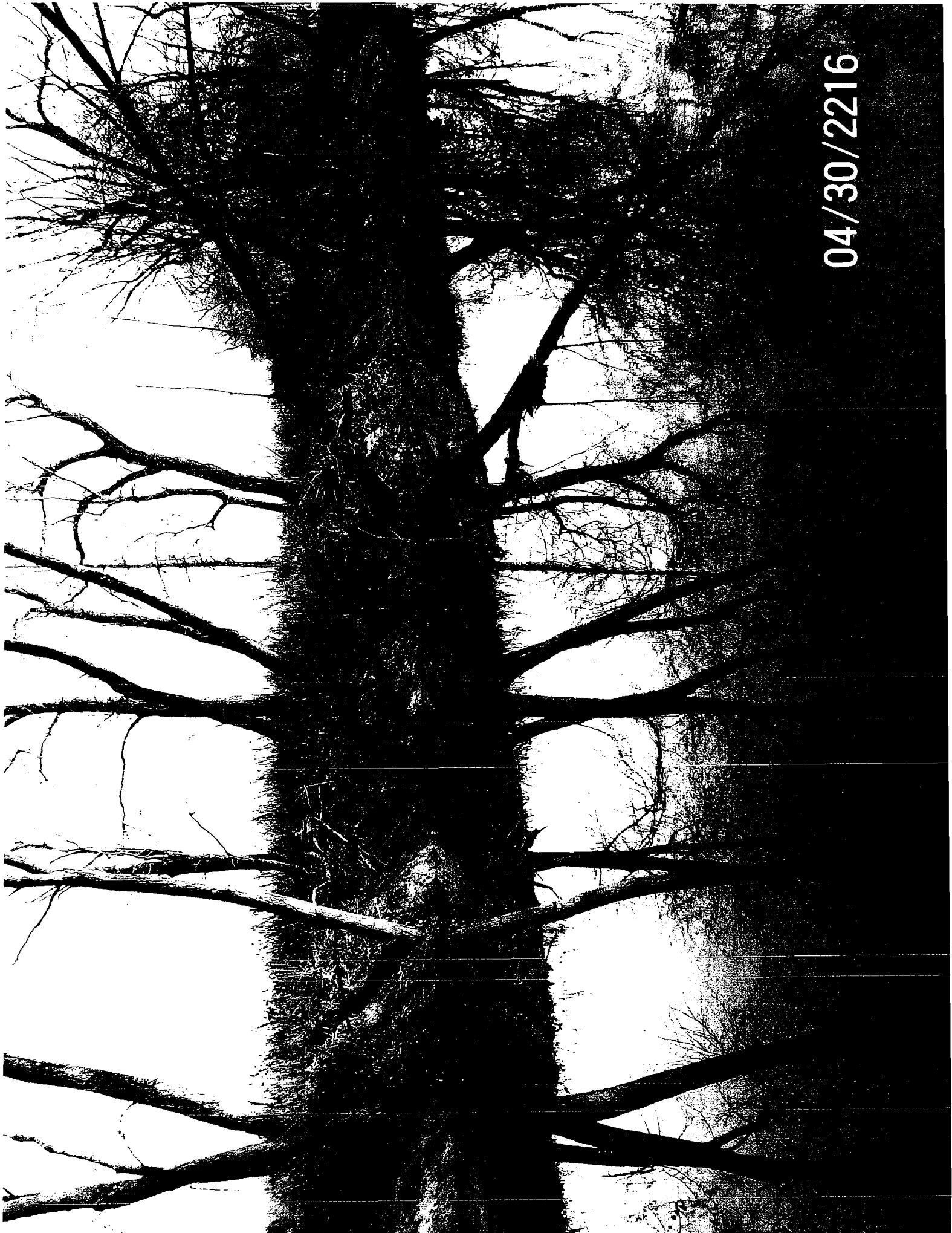
Our Department fully supports the County's efforts to address this threat to a key link in our community's trail system and would strongly encourage the positive consideration of this grant request.

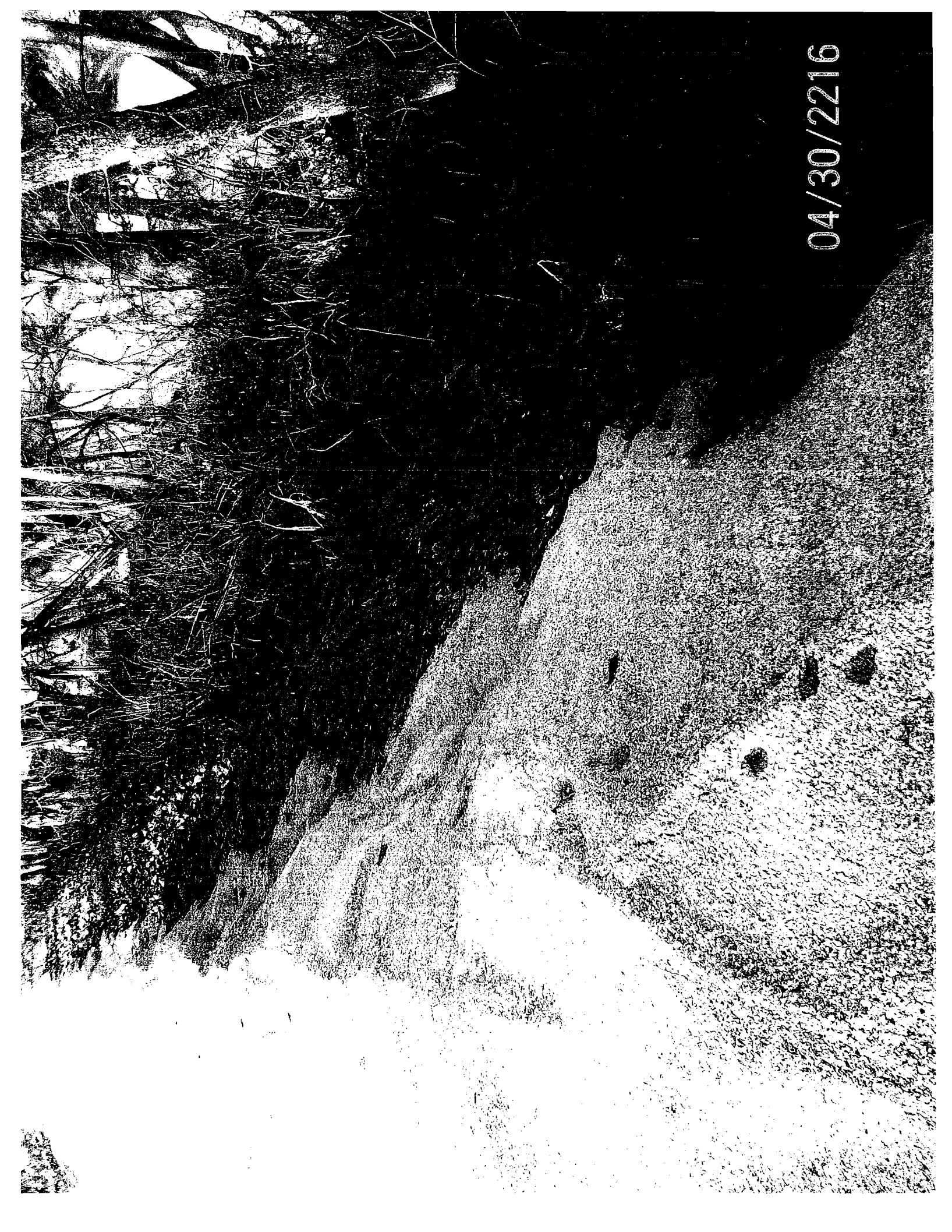
