The meeting was called to order at 1:30PM and roll call was taken.

### **Boone County Sheriff's Office**

#### 1. First Reading: Caldwell County K-9 Maintenance Training Agreement

Captain Brian Leer stated that the Caldwell County Sheriff's Office has been a partner to Boone County in K-9 training for a couple of years, and is up for a renewal on the maintenance agreement with Boone County. Captain Leer stated if this agreement is approved, it will be effective from April 28, 2024, until April 28, 2025, for a total of \$2,000.00.

Commissioner Kendrick stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

### 2. First Reading: Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement with City of Ashland

Captain Brian Leer stated this agreement allows Ashland officers to take law enforcement action anywhere within Boone County as needed, and wouldn't be limited to the city limits of Ashland. Captain Leer stated this agreement has been presented to the City of Ashland, and they are on board with it.

Commissioner Kendrick stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

# 3. First Reading: Budget Amendment – Department 1253 - Unspent SCCG Funds 2023

Captain Leer stated this amendment is for funds awarded but unspent through the 2023 State Cyber Crimes Grant. Captain Leer stated the grant came about because they asked for a new position to be funded. Captain Leer stated they did not proceed with creating or filling the position until the grant was approved. Captain Leer stated the grant award was made in July, 2023, but it took several months to get the position filled, so they had savings of around \$18,000.00 within the grant fund that was recognized as unspent. Captain Leer stated Lt. Shae was contacted by the State Cyber Crimes Grant administrators, who asked if the office could spend that money prior to July.

Commissioner Kendrick stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.
