The meeting was called to order at 1:30PM and roll call was taken.

Resource Management

1. Second Reading: Road Relinquishment Agreement - Portion of Old Plank Road - First Read 07.16.24

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve a Road Relinquishment Agreement with the City of Columbia related to a portion of Old Plank Road.

The terms of the agreement are in the attached agreement and the Presiding Commissioner is authorized to sign the same.

Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order #350-2024**

2. Second Reading: Quit Claim Deed – Portion of Old Plank Road – First Read 07.16.24

Services Program here in Boone County, with a Juvenile Justice program, and in all of the presentations, the Department of Justice and Health and Human Services people were there listening to what's happening in Boone County. Commissioner Thompson stated they are taking note of what's happening here, and they said to let them know when Boone County needs funding. Commissioner Thompson stated it was great to know they were impressed by Boone County.

Commissioner Kendrick stated they talked to the Boone County Collector earlier about an update for the senior property tax relief program. Commissioner Kendrick stated, by end of day today, it will be 12 business days that the program has been open and over 1,600 applications will have been submitted and most of them reviewed. Commissioner Kendrick stated they are processing those in a very quick turn-around time, and are figuring out some ways the Commission office and County Government can help the Collector's office process these, including having at least six hours a day where an additional outside notary is there to notarize, in addition to all the notaries at the window. Commissioner Kendrick stated this is important to cut down on wait times and processing times in accepting each application. Commissioner Kendrick stated Boone County's numbers are tracking proportionately with St. Charles County's implementation went at this point.

Commissioner Kendrick stated that on Monday, Boone County Road & Bridge will be in Hallsville cleaning up and removing debris that has been piled on city property. Commissioner Kendrick stated he appreciates the partnership between the City of Hallsville and Boone County Road & Bridge and Boone County Emergency Management to address the impact of the severe storm that went through. Commissioner Kendrick stated while it was a disaster, it was a localized disaster so there were no state or federal declarations were made, which would have triggered the ability to recover funds from either state or federal partners on debris removal. Commissioner Kendrick stated they have developed an internal program with the Office of Emergency Management to be able to reimburse the Road & Bridge Department for any work they do to remove. And, in future cases, if debris results from a local disaster, we can work with local municipal partners on finding outside vendors to be able to do it. Commissioner Kendrick stated he appreciates the work and collaboration with Hallsville Clerk Kenyetta Ridgeway-Sample on making sure they can figure out ways to process improve and this is a new program we are starting and piloting this Monday, and he is excited about what this means for next year.
