1. First and Second Reading: ARPA Funding Subrecipient: C000806 – Welcome Inn with 1612 N. Providence, L.L.C., a Missouri Limited Liability Company, d/b/a Welcome Inn

Director of Purchasing Melinda Bobbitt read the following memo:

Boone County, Missouri received ARPA grant funding from the federal government and the County Commission engaged in an RFP process to determine ARPA funding awards. This ARPA award is for County contract ARPA Funding Subrecipient: C000806 - Welcome Inn with 1612 N. Providence, L.L.C., a Missouri Limited Liability Company, d/b/a Welcome Inn.

The funds will be used to support Welcome Inn in renovating their property so they can better serve individuals and families experiencing homelessness. Renovations include updates to HVAC; renovation of the current commercial kitchen, and updates to the center atrium. Contract award is for a not-to-exceed amount of \$850,000.00 and will be paid from department 2983 - American Rescue Plan Act, account 84200 - Other Contracts.
