

Sheriff Boehm stated these are funds collected through the civil process fees. The Department would like to transfer these funds to the budget line items to purchase printing materials for the DOVE program. There is also a request from the Investigative Division for video equipment that are used on a daily basis for interviews. There is also a request by the Jail to replace a car that was not replaced last year in the budget process.

Commissioner Stamper asked how the civil process fees are generated. Sheriff Boehm stated the service of civil process papers. The Sheriff is allowed to collect a specified amount of dollars, depending on the type of paper that is being served, and the law allows up to \$50,000 per year to be put in this special budget. Anything that is in excess of the \$50,000 goes back into General Revenue.

Commissioner Miller asked if the flat screen monitors would be for Pod A at the Jail. Sheriff Boehm stated that is correct, the flat screens would be for Pod A and D. Each Pod has a monitor for the locking system. When one monitor breaks, it is chaos to get a new unit into the Pod and also, when one breaks, they have to go to manual locking and unlocking. Sheriff Boehm stated he would actually like to purchase two new monitors; one to replace the current monitor and the other for storage.

Commissioner Elkin asked if there is a State Contract for the Police Cars. Sheriff Boehm stated that was correct. The vehicle would be purchased through the Purchasing Department from the State Contract.

There was no further discussion of this issue.

Commissioner Stamper stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading and public hearing after the required 10 day waiting period, with an appropriate order for approval.

Sheriff Boehm noted the Sheriff's Department has received notification of approval from the U.S. Department of Justice that \$250,000 grant was approved. This grant was applied for six months ago by the Department. This money will be used for two school resource officers.

The Department is preparing a budget to be submitted to the Auditor's office and the County Commission.

Sheriff Boehm stated this is a three year grant.

Commissioner Stamper stated this is a three year grant and asked if this would be covering two officers' salaries and equipment. Sheriff Boehm stated the money would cover salaries and benefits packages.

Commissioner Stamper asked if it would be the Sheriff's intent to use them as school resource officers as designed by the grant in various County schools. Sheriff Boehm stated Harrisburg will be receiving one officer. The Department has spoken with Midway Heights Elementary, Rock Bridge Elementary, and Two Mile Prairie Elementary before the Department applied for the grant and each showed interest in having an officer. The Department is still working out details with the schools as to whether it would be on a per week or per day basis. If there is any additional time left, the officer may try to help in Hallsville.
