Ground Rules (Adapted from University of Michigan Guidelines for Discussing Difficult or High Stakes Topics)

- Listen respectfully.
- Listen actively and with an ear to 'understanding others' views.
- Discuss ideas.
- Commit to learning, not debating. Comment to share information, not to persuade.
- Avoid blame, speculation, and inflammatory language.
- Allow everyone the chance to speak if they choose to do so.
- Avoid assumptions about any member of a social group. Do not ask individuals to speak for their (perceived) social group.

Thriving communities are those that support opportunities to boost upward mobility and aim to narrow racial and ethnic inequities for children, youth, and adults.
