1. Welcome and Introductions

Al began the meeting and opened the floor for introductions

- 2. Action Step Assessment: Pipeline/Career Opportunities for youth
  - a. (Action step #9) Increase opportunities to expose youth to careers in middle and high school.
    - Group members discussed what their affiliated organization offers or hopes to offer to help with job readiness for kids in middle/high school.
    - Members discussed the necessity for exploration routes for students so that they are
      aware of all the different career options and to also know the details of those careers so
      that they can choose their best fit. Discussion of current and past programs and events
      exposing youth to different careers included an update on programs Columbia Chamber
      of Commerce has received funding to implement.
    - The group mentioned the need of collaboration with other organizations to share information to maximize opportunities for students while not duplicating efforts. Love Columbia shared their "Career Next Steps" website which can help with these efforts. The workgroup is interested is creating a resource to share with businesses about available programs and services supports job and workforce development. Homework for the group is to email Gina information they would like to include about programs they provide, and the compiled information will be reviewed during the next workgroup meeting
    - The group discussed obstacles such as transportation and how we can help break down those barriers.

Verna joined the meeting virtually towards the end and shared she is learning information while at the Columbia Chamber of Commerce trip to bring back.

The workgroup discussed if there were others focusing on youth career exploration and exposure that should be introduced to the workgroup. Everyone was encouraged to make
